We work to support and enhance the Trans Pennine Trail for all users — it is a national coast to coast route for recreation and transport — for walkers, cyclists and (in parts) horse riders. The Stockport section runs between East Didsbury and Reddish Vale Country Park (mostly within the Heatons South, and Brinnington & Central Wards). Activities include cutting back vegetation, mending fences, planting bulbs, signage checks, litter picking and anything else agreed with our Greenspace Officer as needing to be done. We have recently installed six new interpretation boards with funding that we received from the Tesco Bags of Help fund.

2. About Your Application

9. Please give us a brief description of your proposed/planned project or activityYou may wish to include details of what activities will take place, where will it happen, how often and who will take part. If you are applying for equipment you can tell us what will it be used for and why is it needed.

We would like to buy a STIHL BGA 85 cordless leaf blower for our volunteer group to use to maintain the traffic-free sections of the Trans Pennine Trail within Stockport (and also other linking routes which are part of the National Cycle Network). This would make it much more efficient for us to keep the trail clear of fallen leaves particularly during the Autumn, but would also be useful all year round. Stockport MBC currently does no leaf clearing along the trail and so they just accumulate and rot down, allowing mud to build up along the sides of the trail and resulting in accelerated degradation of the non-bound TopTrek surfacing and also the Bitmac surfaces. Long term, this will either result in the trail becoming less accessible or requiring more funds to be found to maintain and repair it.

A single leaf blower would mean we could keep the whole of the trail within Stockport clean and clear for all users, something we cannot realistically do by hand. This will help to reduce long-term degradation of the surfaces. Members of our group have done the required Task Leader and Power Tool training sessions run by Stockport Council and we have public liability insurance.

10. Who will benefit from this grant?

e.g. local residents, young people, older people and how?

Anyone in Stockport who uses the Trans Pennine Trail – we get up to 1000 users a day (walkers, cyclists, horse riders, users in motorised wheelchairs) along the section in Heaton Mersey (according to the TfGM counter located near Vale Rd). Many of these will be local residents who live close to the trail, but a lot of people also use it as a commuter route (walking and cycling). Much of the trail is also a bridleway, and there are a couple of stables located close to the trail. The health benefits of having a traffic-free trail which is useable all year round cannot be underestimated – it is a huge asset for the local community.

10(a) How Many Stockport residents will benefit?

Potentially everyone who lives in Stockport, since all of the trail is publically accessible 24/7. There is also a traffic-free link to Cheadle and one of the Beelines projects will provide a link through the Brinnington Tunnel to join up with the Alan Newton Way through to Marple.

10(b) Are there any restrictions on who will benefit from the funding?

No, as long as they are non-motorised users of the trail.

11(a) How much will the project/activity cost in total?

£446.16 inc VAT, for a STIHL BGA 85 cordless leaf blower

Our Stockport MBC Greenspace Officer, Wayne Bardsley, has indicated he can procure the leaf blower on our behalf, presumably at a lower price than we would be able to get ourselves. I do not have a formal quotation, but Wayne can confirm the price.

11(b) Tell us about other any other sources of income you have already applied for or raised so far in relation to this project

We have not currently applied for funding from elsewhere towards a leaf blower.

However, as a group we have received £10,000 of funding from the Tesco Bags of Help fund, all of which has been spent on the Trans Pennine Trail. We are also seeking funding from companies on the local Business Park to replace a couple of benches at the seating area at the bottom of Vale Rd (as we have been told the Council has no money to do this) - so far we have been given £500 towards these.

12. How much are you applying for from the Ward Flexibility Budget?

The majority of the Trans Pennine Trail in Stockport runs through the Heatons South and the Brinnington & Central Wards, so we have split our request between the two.
