


EXTRACTS FROM NEWSLETTERS 2018

PLATFORM 1 ART PROJECT - NOVEMBER




We are delighted to report that all the artwork has now been completed, photographed and formatted and is now with the printer. We will soon take delivery of the eleven aluminium panels.

We have now obtained the services of Anne Bennison Photography to do all the photographic work.
