# No Waiting at Any Time:

# Magda Road

South Westerly side from a point 10 metres South West of the South Westerly kerb line of Eyam Grove in a North Easterly direction to a point 10 metres North East of the North Easterly kerb line of Eyam Grove.

South Westerly side from the South Westerly kerb line of Hartington Road for a distance of 10 metres in a South Westerly direction.

## Eyam Grove

Both sides from the South Westerly kerb line of Magda Road for a distance of 10 metres in a South Easterly direction.

## Hartington Road

South Westerly side from the South Westerly kerb line of Magda Road for a distance of 10 metres in a South Easterly direction.

North Westerly side from a point level with the South Westerly building line of No. 28 in a South Westerly direction to the cul-de-sac end (Inc. Turning Head).

South Easterly side from a point 0.5 metres South West of the projected boundary line between Numbers 26 & 28 in South Westerly direction to the cul-de-sac end and to tie in with the above.

## Magda Road, Eyam Grove & Hartington Road, Offerton

Report of the Corporate Director for Place Management & Regeneration

## 1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

To approve No Waiting restrictions on parts of Magda Road, Eyam Grove and Hartington Road in Offerton.

### 2. BACKGROUND

Network Management received representation concerning the matters described below:

<u>Magda Road & Eyam Grove:</u> It is reported that vehicles parking on both arms of this junction can be a hazard for other road users. Note: According to the Highway Code, drivers should avoid parking within 10 metres of a junction for road safety and traffic management purposes.

<u>Magda Road & Hartington Road:</u> It is reported that vehicles parked on the westerly arm of the junction (which is in effect a blind-bend) are causing a hazard amid on-coming traffic.

<u>Hartington Road:</u> A request has been made for the provision of parking restrictions in the Turning Head at the bottom of the cul-de-ac so that vehicles can turn around safely. To reduce the need for vehicles to reverse the approximate length 160m of Hartington Road. Avoid the dropped kerbs at the cul-de-sac end being blocked, this is a pedestrian access to Dial Park Road.

## 3. PROPOSALS

In view of the above, the proposals shown on drawing number: **NM8-5007-001** went to a local consultation with residents.

## 4. LEGAL POSITION/IMPLICATIONS

The Traffic Management Orders would be made under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Council is required by the Local Authorities Traffic Order (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 to give notice of its intention to make a Traffic Order (by publishing a draft traffic order). These regulations also require the Council to consider any representations received as a result of publishing the draft Order.

# 5. CONSULTATION

The consultation (delivered in agreement with the Ward Spokespersons) did not result in any adverse feedback; however, we did receive a request from an occupant on Hartington Road to introduce restrictions on the easterly arm of the junction with Magda Road. As the basis for the request was not directly related to traffic management (and the fact that this part of Magda Road provides some convenient on-street parking space) it was decided to report the scheme to Area Committee without any amendments.

# 6. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS
