Report of the Corporate Director for Place Management & Regeneration

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To report the findings of a consultation exercise and to seek approval for the introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) as shown in **Appendix A**

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1. Traffic Services have received a request from the Highway Ward Spokesperson for the Cheadle Hulme South Ward to investigate traffic issues on Ravenoak Park Road at the junction with Ravenoak Road, as it has been reported that on occasions vehicles are parking on the junction. The parked vehicles are said to be causing an obstruction together with creating a hazard and are reducing visibility for other road users.
- 2.2. Traffic Services have previously consulted with residents with regards to the reported issues back in 2018 however, at that time, only one response was received. The response received was against the proposals and therefore, the scheme was not pursued. Further concerns have been raised leading to a second consultation being carried out.
- 2.3. Traffic Services Officers have been out to the location on a number of occasions and have themselves observed vehicles parked on Ravernoak Park Road close to the junction of Ravenoak Road.

3. PROPOSALS

- 3.1. Due to the nature of the concerns raised, Traffic Services propose to introduce a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) 'No Waiting At Any Time' on the junction of Ravenoak Park Road and Ravenoak Road. It is anticipated that by doing this, visibility and the safety of both motorists and pedestrians can be greatly improved.
- 3.2. The proposals outlined above are shown on **Drawing No. NM8-5013-01.**
- 3.3. The proposals outlined support The Highway Code Rule 243 which states 'DO NOT stop or park: opposite or within 10 meters (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space.
- 3.4. The Council has a duty of care for the general public and thus, if nothing is done to alleviate any potential difficulties in accessing the junction, there is the possibility that should an emergency arise, there is a chance that the response time could be considerably longer.

4. LEGAL POSITION/IMPLICATIONS

4.1. The Traffic Management Orders would be made under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Council is required by the Local Authorities Traffic Order (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 to give notice of its intention to make a Traffic Order (by publishing a draft traffic order). These regulations also require the Council to consider any representations received as a result of publishing the draft Order.

5. CONSIDERATION OF ALTERNATIVE SOLUTIONS

5.1. No other alternatives were considered.

6. CONSULTATION

- 6.1. The Local Ward Councillors have been consulted and no adverse comments were received.
- 6.2. The Police have been consulted and no objections to the proposals have been received.
- 6.3. Affected frontages were consulted with.

From a total of 8 No. letters delivered to residents, we received 2 No. (25%) responses of which 1 No. (50%) agreed with the proposals and 1 No. (50%) disagreed.

Those that disagreed with the proposals stated that their position had not changed since last year (when they had responded to a previous consultation re the introduction of a TRO 'No Waiting At Any Time' at this same location). They stated they did not share the concerns raised and that they had not noticed any parked vehicles causing an obstruction at the location proposed for the TRO. They further stated there is no need to spend public money solving a non-existent problem.

Those that agreed with the proposals stated that they totally agreed with the proposals. That they themselves have struggled on many occasions to get out of the road due to inconsiderate parking.

7. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

7.1. The estimated cost of the scheme is as follows:

8.1. Programmed to be implemented March 2020, subject to no objections due legal advertisement stage.

Appendix A

Proposed (TRO) Schedule

No Waiting at Any Time

Ravenoak Park Road

<u>Both Sides</u> – From the intersection of the western kerb line of Ravenoak Road for a distance of 12 meters in a westerly direction.

Ravenoak Road

<u>West Side</u> – From a point 11.5 meters south of the projected southern kerb line of Ravenoak Park Road for a distance of 30 meters in a northerly direction.
