Summary:

The Borough does not have enough places for secondary students with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. In order to address the shortage of places Stockport Council submitted an Expression of Interest to the Department of Education under Wave 2 of Special Free School applications. Four Multi Academy Trusts (MATs) interested in running a Special Secondary Free school in Stockport Metropolitan Borough Council were shortlisted and interviewed by the DfE and Senior Officers from Stockport Council. Following assessments and interviews one Multi- Academy was selected to run the Secondary Special School in Stockport. (Formal announcement is awaited from the DfE). The new school will create approximately 200 places for pupils with SEND in the secondary sector. Students will be educated locally, and this represents significant savings compared to the cost of out of area SEND provision. Young people will also stay within their communities.
