At the heart of Marple's community, the Sports Club exists to support increased active participation for all, and to provide a hub for other local community organisations.

From our youngest Juniors age 5 through to our Dementia Friends, we provide a range of sporting and social activities for the whole community to participate in, including cricket, squash, Junior Boxercise, Young Leaders volunteer pathways, Squash Girls Can, Family film nights and more.

We have eight junior cricket teams including a girls team; four senior cricket teams; two mens' squash teams; a ladies squash team and a fast growing Junior Squash section.

All this is possible thanks to the hard work of a team of volunteers. Our ethos is that active participation includes mental and physical wellbeing, and all our activities and volunteer opportunities promote this.

#### 9. Please give us a brief description of your proposed/planned project or activity

Our project is simple: to install much needed cycle and scooter racks at the club, as soon as possible.

Following a refurbishment of the car park and driveway (making cycling and scooting less puncture prone!), and with Government and ECB guidelines surrounding travel to sporting activities (restrictions on car sharing), our members and visitors are keen to travel by bike and scooter.

Our successful Junior Squash programme which has developed from nothing in Sept 2019 to a weekly coaching programme and full League team sees the Juniors travelling to the Club after school by scooter and bike.

During lockdown, Club sports members have joined a Marple Sports Club Strava group, many taking up cycling for the first time. We want to ensure we are supporting the continuation of this.

In essence, we need somewhere secure for members, staff and visitors to store their bikes, so they will be confident to travel to the Club by this method.

We are proud to work in positive partnerships with many groups who promote sustainable travel, including SK Spinners cycling group; local WalkRide groups; Transport for Greater Manchester Sustainable Journeys team. During lockdown, together we supported a community wide initiative, deliver food parcels from Asda via an electric cargo bike loaned from TfGM. Adding the bike and scooter racks and promoting travel to the club by bike and scooter strengthens our commitment to these groups.

Junior and senior members of the club; visitors and visiting teams; parents; staff; local cycling club stopping at the club for a coffee; families; older people. Visitors attending other community organisations' activities at the club eg Zumba/ Bootcamps/ Footytotz.

Everyone will benefit in the confidence they can travel to the club by a sustainable method, with the confidence there is a place to securely store their bike or scooter when they get there.

Our membership alone includes residents from Marple North; Marple South; Compstall; Romiley; Offerton; Mellor; Bredbury and beyond the local Stockport borders.

Based on local surveys; Up to 50 people per week. This will rise as the community knows about the facility.
