Report of the Corporate Director for Place Management & Regeneration

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

To approve No Waiting at Any Time restrictions on part of Buxton Road in Hazel Grove.

2. BACKGROUND

Network Management received representation from a local Ward Councillor concerning a situation on Buxton Road.

With the construction of the Airport Bypass, some drivers of heavy freight vehicles are using the westerly part of the 'old' Buxton Road as a rest-stop. This is causing a particular problem for occupants in the first property on the north easterly side as wagons are pulling-up adjacent to the driveway and seriously hindering visibility of on-coming traffic.

3. PROPOSALS

In agreement with the Ward Spokesperson, a proposal was drafted for the provision of No Waiting at Any Time restrictions (double yellow lines) across the lowered-kerb access of the said and adjacent property and extending for a distance of 15 metres to protect visibility on that side. Please see the attached drawing number: **NM8-4114-001**.

4. LEGAL POSITION/IMPLICATIONS

The Traffic Management Orders would be made under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Council is required by the Local Authorities Traffic Order (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 to give notice of its intention to make a Traffic Order (by publishing a draft traffic order). These regulations also require the Council to consider any representations received as a result of publishing the draft Order.

5. CONSULTATION

The consultation (August 2020) resulted in responses from two other households. The content of the feedback can be summarised as follows:

• Parking restrictions are only likely to serve to displace the problem further along causing the same problem for other householders.

- Wagons parking on the south westerly side of the road (i.e. adjacent to the grass verge which divides the main carriageway with the access road) can be a nuisance. Sometimes wagons are parked overnight and can be an eyesore in a residential area. Therefore, this side of the road should also be subject to parking restrictions.
- General traffic is not respecting the 20mph speed limit on the road.

Network Management – General Comments:

To allay the concerns about displaced parking, the extent of the double yellow lines has been reduced by 5 metres. Please see attached drawing number: **NM8-4114-001A**. This will leave 20 metres of unrestricted space for a larger wagon to park in the 'gap' between the bus clearway and the entry to the first property - whilst still providing 10 metres of protection for that property. The officer in charge has been in contact with the occupant who is willing (albeit reluctantly) to proceed on this basis.

Parking restrictions along the south westerly side of the road are likely to displace the wagons on to the opposite side - directly in front of the residential properties; obviously this would not be a desirable outcome for the householders.

It may be feasible to introduce a weight limit order along the full extent of the old Buxton Road. However, such an order would have an exemption for access, and wagon drivers needing a rest could use this as a legitimate defence for entering the weight limit zone.

An order to create a no HGV parking zone can only be made in exceptional circumstances and may require special authorisation from the Dept. for Transport.

Heavy freight vehicles over 3.5T parked overnight on residential streets (in contravention of the operators licence) can be reported to the Traffic Commissioner in Leeds.

Speed reduction was not part of the brief for this consultation and would have to be treated as an entirely separate investigation. Enforcement of the current speed limit would be a matter for GM Police as a moving traffic offence.

6. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

7. TIMESCALES

If approved the order is expected to become operative in the earlier part of 2021.

9. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Area Committee recommends that the Cabinet Member (Sustainable Stockport) approves the legal advertising of the following Traffic Regulation Order and subject to no objections being received within 21 days from the advertisement date the following order can be made:

No Waiting at Any Time:

Buxton Road

North Easterly side from a point 6 metres South East of the projected boundary line between No's 91 & 93 for a distance of 23.5 metres in a North Westerly direction.
