The Rotary Club of Stockport Lamplighter has toured the streets and store sites of the Stockport Metropolitan Borough with the Christmas Float every December since 1994 to raise funds for local charities, self help groups and worthy causes. The Christmas Float, built in 1994, has performed well since then but now has problems which our proposed project needs to address by updating throughout.

The current system requires a petrol generator to power the float lights and sound system. This is noisy and polluting, and the use of 240V presents safety challenges. It is proposed to replace the generator with two deep cycle 12V batteries, replace the current lighting system with low power LED equivalent and the music sound with Bluetooth Speakers.

There needs to be an inspection of the trailer that transports the Christmas Float, to be carried out by a qualified mechanic to ensure compliance with current regulations. Rewire towing cable connector, to match the wiring of recent new connections.

Replace emergency brake cable and coil spring. Paint and sundries to both float and trailer.

#### 10. Who will benefit from this grant?

The Rotary Club of Stockport Lamplighter members and friends collected on the Christmas Float at store sites, Stockport town centre and the streets of Stockport Metropolitan Borough in bottle collections in the month of December 2019 the sum of £12012.. This money together others raised is used to benefit mainly local charities, self help groups youth activities and worthy causes in Stockport determined by our club.

During the past 12 months some of the beneficiaries of donations were Stockport Samaritans £650, Stockport Salvation Army £250, Beechwood £350, PPE £1000, Stockport Refuge without Abuse £900, Francis House £250, Friends of Heaton Norris £250 Reddish Dementia £500 Signpost Young Carers £300, Stockport Foodbank £500, Walthew House £350, Cherry Tree Project £200, All Saints School £350. Impact Social £250 Social Services Beds £250, Westmorland School Brinnington £720 for Language Development Packs £720, Loaves and Fishes Homeless Charity £350, Social services microwave for a needy family, Scout and Guide Groups, Computer Tablets to St Annes Hospice. We gave a Christmas Party for 90 Stockport senior citizens, and assisted the council in litter picking. In November 2019 Lamplighters in conjunction with another Rotary Club Collected 2914 items of winter clothing which was distributed to charities in Stockport for the homeless and people Experiencing difficult times.

The donations listed show the wide range of people helped by the fund raised by the Christmas Float and the need to keep the Christmas Float in good up to date order to help the deserving causes in our Stockport Community.
