# **Reservoir Road - Barriers**

Report of the Corporate Director for Place Management & Regeneration

### 1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To seek approval for the introduction of barrier system.

### 2. BACKGROUND

2.1 Over the last few year SMBC have received several reports in regard to motorbikes using the footway/cycleway over the Reservoir on Reservoir Road, Edgeley, Stockport. The reports received refer to motorbikes speeding across this section, using the footway side and that there is a lack of preventative measures to stop this access to motorbikes, causing concern to pedestrians and cyclists alike for their safety.

Located south west of the town, the section of segregated pedestrian/cycleway on Reservoir Road is a continuous footway/cycleway that cross the Reservoir from Hardcastle Road side to Moscow Road East side.

### 3. PROPOSALS

- 3.1. To introduce a barrier system on the segregated footway/cycleway of Reservoir Road at Hardcastle Street side of Reservoir Road, as shown on **Drawing No. NM1-6331-04\_Reservoir\_Rd\_Barriers**, which will help to deter the use of motorised bikes along this stretch.
- 3.2. The Council has a duty of care for the general public and to make accessibility to all. Thus, the council are restricted in preventing the use of motorbikes and there is the possibility that the council may be preventing access for residents and visitors alike with impaired vision and mobility. Therefore, the barrier system promoted is a measure to deter rather than a physical stopping measure.
