Service Road for 162 to 188 Kingsway - Two Way Traffic Ahead Warning Signage

Report of the Corporate Director for Place Management & Regeneration

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To seek approval for the supply and installation of advanced warning signage in order to highlight to motorists two-way traffic ahead.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1. Traffic Services have been approached by the local ward councillors to provide additional signage in order to highlight to motorists two-way traffic is ahead.
- 2.2. Signage is currently in place on the one-way section of the Kingsway Service Road; Give Way signage is located on both the left- and right-hand side the Kingsway Service Road and Mardale Drive junction. There is signage indicating two-way traffic, this is positioned on the right-hand side of the junction. In addition to this, there are Give Way markings painted at the junction, and SLOW markings are painted in the carriageway approximately 30 yards ahead of reaching the junction. Once at the junction, there are directional arrows painted on the carriageway ahead indicating it is two-way traffic.
- 2.3. Traffic Services have advised the local ward councillors that the current signage, and its location, is in accordance with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions (TSRGD). Traffic Services have further advised that too much signage can make drivers become more complacent.
- 2.4. Whilst existing signage and road markings are already in situ, the local councillors have requested additional signage be installed.

3. PROPOSALS

- 3.1. In order to provide further warning to motorists, Traffic Services propose to install an Additional Warning Sign will warn motorists two-way traffic is 30 yards ahead. These proposals are shown on **Drawing No. NM36-Kingsway Service Road-01**.
- 3.2. There is existing directional cycle signage located on site, which is on a small pole. This pole will need to be replaced in order for the new signage to be installed however, the directional cycle signage will be re-installed onto the new pole.
