Report of the Corporate Director for Place Management & Regeneration

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To seek approval to install 6 bollard posts on both sides of the controlled crossing point on the footway at Stockport Road, between Sandown Road and Kent Road, in order to prevent overrunning of the footway in order to park on the footway

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 Traffic Services have been approached by the Ward Councillor Spokesperson in regard to vehicles parking behind the controlled pedestrian crossing and overrunning the footway on Stockport Road around the crossing points on both sides, (between Sandown Road & Kent Road). This parking manoeuvre is a danger to pedestrians.

3. PROPOSALS

- 3.1. To introduce 6 bollard type posts around the vicinity of the crossing point on Stockport Road, as shown on **Drawing No. NM1-6345-00**, which will help to prevent this illegal use of the footway and prevent parking.
- 3.2. Consultation is not required due to the type of works, but a letter drop will be carried out informing residents these works will be undertaken prior to installation
- 3.3. The Council has a duty of care for the general public and to ensure the highway remains safe. Thus, the installation of the bollards will help to protect pedestrians from vehicles manoeuvring on the footpath.

4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1. The estimated cost of the scheme is as follows:

Installation of 6 bollard type posts £ 2978.80 and all associated works

TOTAL £2978.80

To be funded from the Edgeley Ward Budget.
