

PROPOSED BUSINESS PROGRAMME FOR 2022/23

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To consider the proposed Business Programme for 2022/23.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The proposed Business Programme for 2022/23 is at Appendix 1.
- 2.2 The proposed Business Programme for 2022/23 maintains six cycles of scrutiny committee meetings, Cabinet meetings and Council Meetings and eight cycles of area committees and the Licensing, Environment & Safety and Planning & Highways Regulation committees.
- 2.3 In addition to the six cyclical meetings of the Council Meeting, the additional statutory Annual Meeting of the Council is scheduled to take place within 21 days of the election as required by law.
- 2.4 Until further legislation is made by Parliament, all committee meetings convened under the Local Government Act 1972, will need to proceed in person (physical meetings). Work is ongoing by officers in preparation for hybrid and/or remote meetings in the event that they may be permitted by Parliament in the future.
- 2.5 The proposal takes into account, in so far as possible, councillor requests to avoid holding meetings within school holidays and to avoid holding meetings on religious festivals/holidays/high holy days.
