Scrutiny Panel Meeting One	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Panel received a short report setting out proposals for this review. The Panel agreed that there are a number of opportunities that could be looked at in detail. It was felt that rather than focus solely upon interventions that can delivered within the A&E setting, members should use the A&E setting as a <i>starting point</i> for consideration of this broader range of potential actions (which could all serve to support reductions in alcohol-related attendances). The role of the Scrutiny Panel will be to gather information about each of these, and make recommendations about how these should be implemented or prioritised by partners in Stockport. • It was proposed than the initial Scrutiny meeting be held to consider the existing evidence base and confirm the list of areas for further consideration. Officers will then be tasked with gathering information about each of these in order to make an assessment of the costs and potential benefits at the subsequent meeting of the Scrutiny Panel.
