people's health services

1. BACKGROUND

1.1 At its meeting on 26th May, the Health Scrutiny Committee expressed interest in carrying out a consultation project with older people, to inform the development of the Committee's work programme for 2009/10.

- 1.2 This consultation exercise aims to provide a snapshot of user experiences which can be analysed to identify potential trends and, if appropriate, lead to further indepth follow-up work by the Committee.
 - It is not intended to present a definitive picture of user experiences, but rather a taster of potential issues for further exploration.
- 1.3 In carrying out this piece of work, the Committee aims to proactively involve older people in setting the Scrutiny Committee's work programme, in order to ensure that the Committee's work reflects the needs of local residents.
- 1.4 This report sets out a list of confirmed or planned consultation activities which have been arranged on behalf of the Scrutiny Committee.
