### **4. PCT CONSULTATION ON DEVELOPING AND IMPROVING NON-ACUTE SERVICES FOR OLDER PEOPLE**

During the last municipal year the Health Scrutiny Committee received a series of presentations from the Stockport Primary Care Trust (PCT) on its review of older people's non-acute services. This culminated in the committee making its response to the PCT's statutory consultation at its April meeting. Having received assurances from the PCT and advice from the Director of Public Health the committee supported the proposals in principle. However, this was only on the condition that in the short-term the Cherry Tree service is maintained in tandem with the new service in order to ensure that there is no

shortfall should the new service prove to be inadequate. The committee also made two requests for further information:

- That during the Phase One period set out in the consultation document the committee is kept constantly updated on the investment into the Independent Care Rapid Assessment Service, additional intermediate care service and the expansion in rehabilitation at home service.
- That prior to the closure of the Cherry Tree service the committee requests a comprehensive report setting out how the PCT has satisfied itself that the commissioned new service effectively manages risk, increases capacity in the residential and nursing care homes, and provides demonstrable improvement in the service. If the PCT cannot demonstrate satisfaction then it should reconsider the proposals.

Following the completion of the consultation the Stockport PCT Board are considering a report setting out the outcomes of the consultation. This report is being presented to the scrutiny committee to provide an update on the consultation, and will also offer an opportunity for the PCT to respond to the committee's recommendations. Due to the date of the PCT Board meeting, this report will be sent out to follow this agenda.

Earlier this year Health Scrutiny Committees at Lancashire County Council, Blackpool Council and Cumbria County Council agreed that a reconfiguration of ambulance control rooms being carried out by the North West Ambulance Services (NWAS) constituted a substantial variation. These committees formed a joint committee in order respond to any forthcoming consultation. Other scrutiny committees, including Stockport's Health Scrutiny Committee, felt this wouldn't effect patients and was therefore not a substantial variation, and there have not participated in the joint committee.

The joint committee has now circulated the NWAS's Service Strategy document (attached) as it considers that the proposals contained therein also amount to a substantial variation of

service. The joint committee is again asking scrutiny committees if they want to participate. The joint committee is currently waiting confirmation on whether or not NWS plan to carry out a consultation. If they don't the joint committee will have the option of referring to the Secretary of State.

**The committee is invited to conclude whether or not it feels the proposals in the Service Strategy amount to substantial variation, and as a result the NWS should carry out statutory consultation, and Stockport be involved in making a response.**
