# Report of the Corporate Director for Place Management & Regeneration

### 1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

To approve the costs for the manufacture and placement of new street name plates on Victoria Grove in Heaton Chapel.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

Network Management received representation from the local Ward Councillors acting on behalf of residents on Victoria Grove which is Unadopted Highway. It is reported that vehicles (mostly belonging to non-residents) are parking at the mouth of the junction with Manchester Road and this is causing issues with visibility and safe access for the owner / occupiers.

In order to improve the situation, the residents have requested replacing the existing street name plates with an improved design to mirror those at the junction with the A6 which read: 'PRIVATE ROAD – PARKING FOR RESIDENTS AND THEIR VISITORS ONLY'. Please see the attached sketch drawing number: **NM18-6353**.

The local Councillor who serves as Ward Spokesperson has indicated a willingness to fund the associated cost (£500) from the delegated Ward Budget for the manufacture and placement of new street name plates as shown.

It should be noted that as the street is not Adopted, the Council would be under no future maintenance liability for the name plates if they are vandalised or damaged etc. and the owner / occupiers would have to make private arrangements for repair and replacement.

For information, the residents have been notified about the option of introducing a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) for double yellow lines to prohibit parking. As the TRO would cover part of the Unadopted Highway, the onus would be on the owners / occupiers to start the process by making a formal request to the Council in writing.
