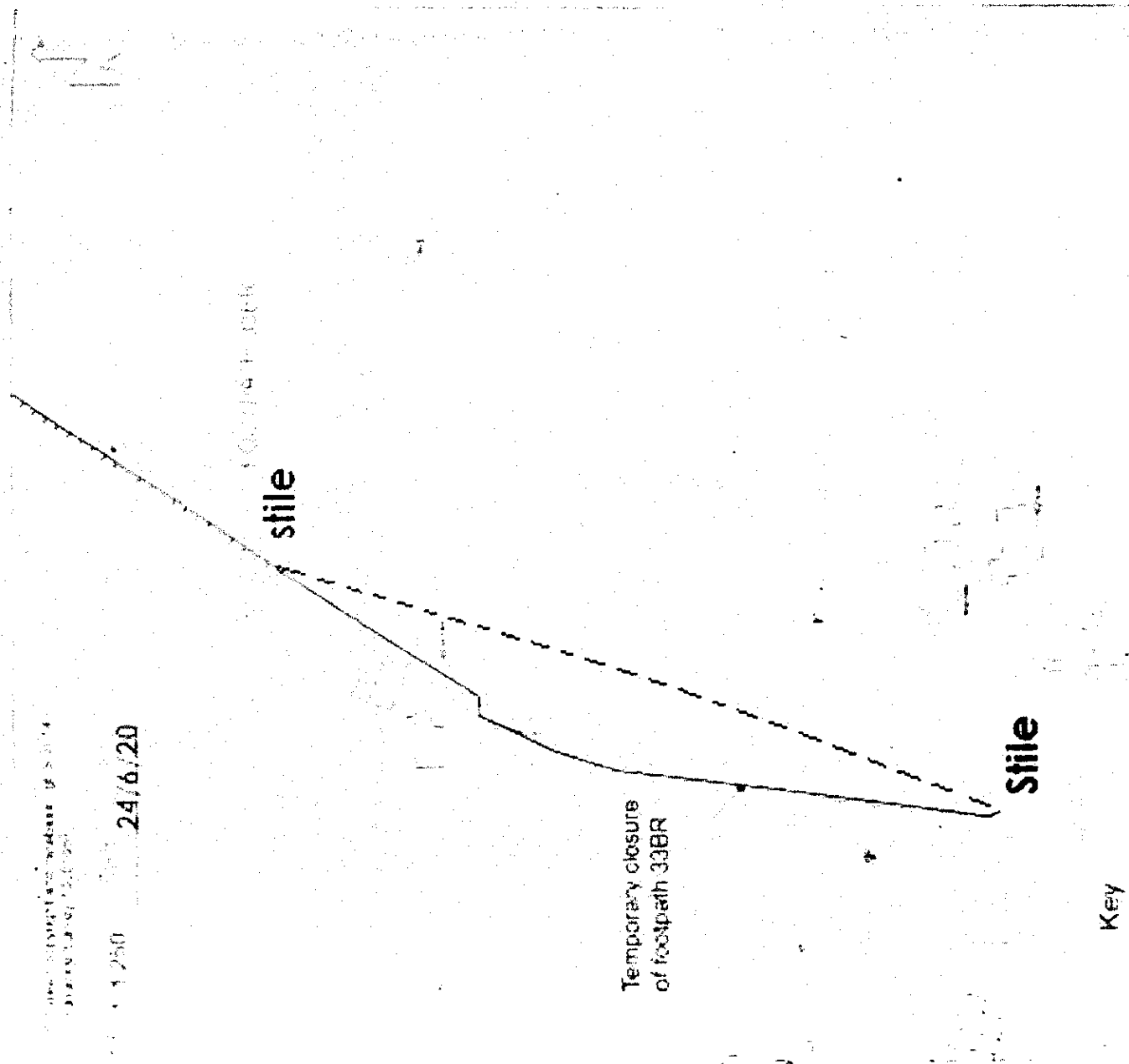

Notes on Procedure

The power of the Local Authority to extinguish a public footpath or bridleway is contained in Section 118 of the Highways Act 1980.

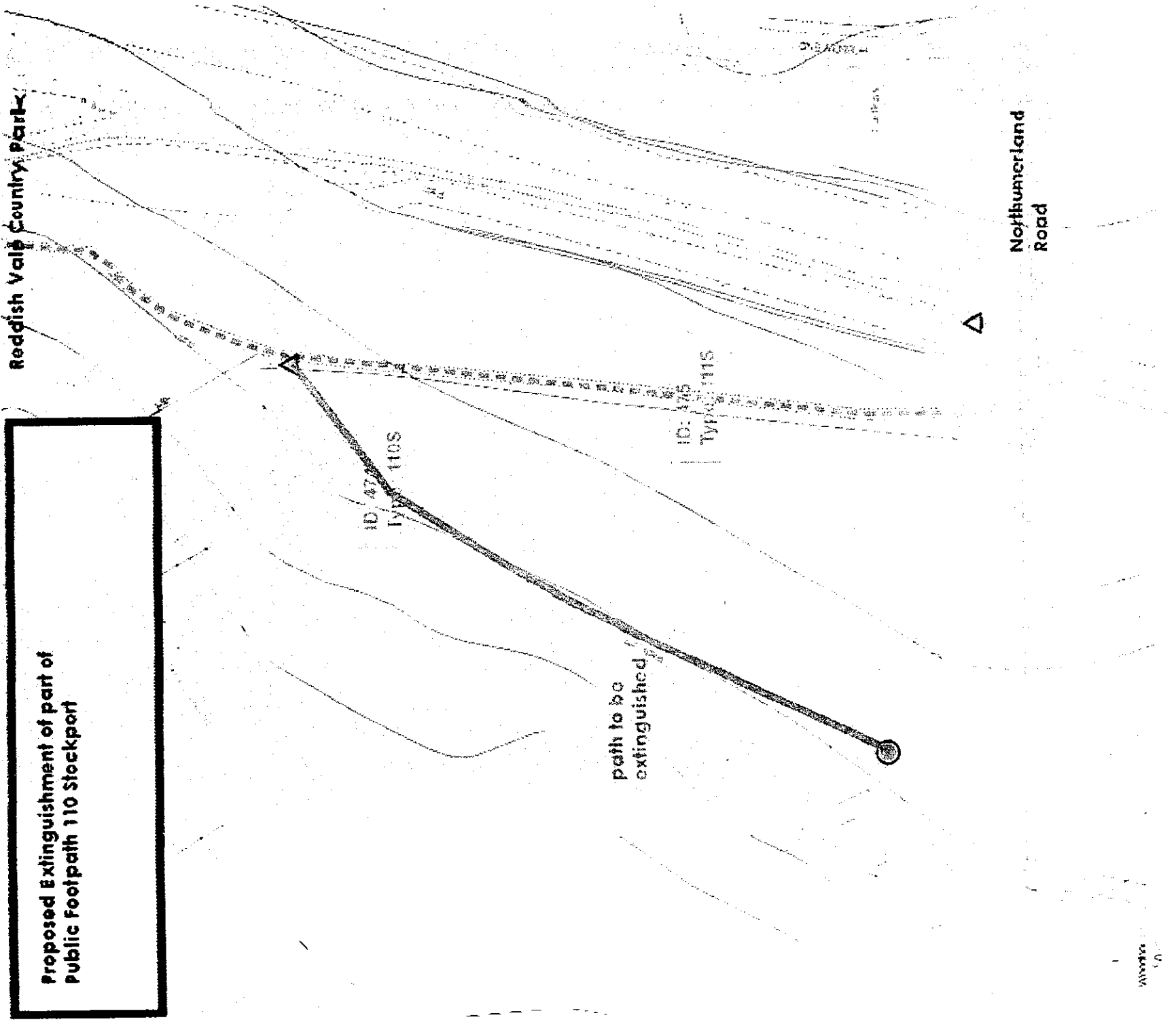
The grounds for making an Order are that the public footpath/bridleway is not needed for public use. The Order is not effective until it is confirmed. The grounds for confirming Orders are that it is expedient to do so having regard to (i) the extent that the path would apart from the Order be likely to be used and (ii) the effect which the extinguishment of the footpath or bridleway would have on the land served by it.

Please note that the procedure for an extinguishment Order can be extremely lengthy and involves;

- (i) Informal discussion with the Rights of Way Officer;
- (ii) A report to the relevant committee(s) of the Council for the authorisation to make the Order;
- (iii) The placing of statutory advertisements of the Order in the local press and notices on site during the objection period;
- (iv) The notification of landowners and prescribed organisations;
- (v) The running of a statutory objection period for a minimum of 28 days. (If objections are received within this period then the Order must be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for him to consider whether it should be confirmed. Normally a public inquiry would be held to determine the matter. If no objections are received, or if those received are withdrawn following negotiation then the Council itself may confirm the Order.
- (vi) The notification of confirmation of the Order (if the Order is confirmed) in the press, on site and to landowners and prescribed organisations;
- (vii) The running of a six week appeal period after publication of the notice of confirmation during which an application can be made to the High Court questioning the validity of the Order.
