

**Additional licence conditions proposed by the Licensing Authority in respect of the review of the premises licence Red and Black Ltd
known as Last Post, Stockport Road, Marple**

Suggested licence condition	Reason why licence condition required	Relevant Licencing objective
1. Any person who appears to be intoxicated or who is behaving in a disorderly manner shall not be allowed entry to the premises or if present at the premises shall be required to leave	There is evidence to demonstrate that customer conduct has been unacceptable and has not been curtailed by management, noise witnessed by officers in residents gardens, customer behaviour witnessed at the premises, the denial by Mr Watson that this behaviour either exists or is unacceptable	Prevention of public nuisance Public safety Protection of children from harm Prevention of Crime and disorder
2. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and kept up to date and made available to Stockport Council authorised officers and Greater Manchester Police upon request . The incident log shall record the following <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Drug related finds/ use/ seizures • Fraudulent ID / underage sales • Complaints received • Persons ejected from the premises • Any faults / defects in CCTV • Any incidents of disorder The log shall provide details of the incident and action taken and the incidents are expected to be recorded in date order	There have been complaints about inappropriate behaviour of customers, allegations of underage drinking , allegations of drug taking, failure to provide CCTV upon request. The completion of an incident log book will assist in any subsequent investigations by Stockport Council or Greater Manchester Police. CCTV from the premises may assist any such investigations. It is important that the incident log book is completed in date order to prevent incidents being recorded at a later date for example CCTV being identified as being defective at the same time an incident occurred would give cause for concern	Prevention of public nuisance Public Safety Protection of children from harm Prevention of crime and disorder
3. The designated premises supervisor shall attend and satisfactorily complete (within 3 months of the decision notice being issued) a formal training course such as the national certificate for designated premises supervisors or BIIAB Award for designated premises supervisors	Officers consider that poor management control at the premises has contributed significantly to the issues that have arisen. It is recognised that in recent weeks there appears to have been a willingness from Mr Watson to improve standards at the premises The training courses listed are specifically for designated premises supervisors and provides them with the knowledge required to undertake the role of designated premises supervisor effectively It is considered important that any such training should	Prevention of public nuisance Public safety Protection of children from harm Prevention of crime and disorder

4. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive digital [colour] CCTV system. All public areas of the licensed premises, including all public entry and exit points, and the street environment will be covered, enabling facial identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV cameras shall continually record while the premises are open to the public and recording shall be kept available and unedited for a minimum of [28] days with the date and time stamping. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be present on the premises at all times when they are open to the public and must be able to produce/download/burn CCTV images upon request by a police officer or an authorised officer of the licensing authority. Any footage must be in a format that can be played back on a standard personal computer or standard DVD player. Where the recording is on a removable medium (ie. compact disc, flash card etc), a secure storage system to store those recording mediums shall be provided.	The current licence condition on the premises licence in respect of CCTV has proved to be inadequate. Mr Watson failed to provide CCTV to officers on at least 5 occasions. Mr Watson commented to officers that there was nothing on the licence condition that specified what the CCTV was required to record (this was when the outside CCTV camera was blocked by the gazebo) . Mr Watson has since upgraded the CCTV system and is should be capable of complying with the required condition. The imposition of the condition prevents the CCTV system from being downgraded at a later date. 5. The supply of alcohol shall only be to a person seated and taking a table meal and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal	When Mr Watson appeared before the subcommittee in November 2020 he advised members that the premises would operate as a bistro. Officers observations on site in May and June 2021 were that the premises was operating as a drinks led sports bar, no persons were witnessed eating food. Customer behaviour was rowdy, shouting, chanting, swearing was common place. Mr Watson will advise the sub committee and officers	Prevention of public nuisance

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	accept that in recent weeks Mr Watson has made every effort to rebrand the premises as food led, it is hoped that this is a permanent commitment and not merely a short term measure to appease the committee. The proposed condition is a way of ensuring that the premises is food led and that the premises does not revert back to a poorly managed, drinks led, rowdy sports bar	
6. The sale of alcohol shall only be by waiter service to seated customers and there shall be no sales of alcohol at the bar	Reasons as for 5 above	Prevention of public nuisance
7. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only and shall not be consumed on the premises	Reasons as for 5 above	Prevention of public nuisance
8. Sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall only be supplied with and ancillary to a takeaway meal	Reasons as for 5 above	Prevention of public nuisance
9. Speakers shall not be located on the outside of the premises	Although there was complaints of music noise shortly after the premises opened, it is accepted that there has been no complaints related to music from the venue since the middle of May, however officers observations regarding customer noise in residents gardens suggests that noise from the venue does travel particular across Stockport rd to premises in Hollins green rd. Amplified music on the outdoor terrace will likely give rise to noise complaints	Prevention of public nuisance
10. There shall be no screenings of sports or music on the outside of the premises this includes screens inside the premises but positioned in such a way that they face the outside areas	The showing of screened sports has encouraged inappropriate behaviour from customers. 11. Staff shall monitor customers in the external area and ensure they do not cause public nuisance	Customer conduct witnessed by officers in May and June was unacceptable and went unchallenged by management	Prevention of public nuisance

The outside areas shall be closed and clear of customers by no later than 10.30pm	By 10.30pm background noise levels have reduced and the impact of noise from licensed premises is greater, by ensuring all customers are inside the venue after 10.30pm it reduces the opportunity for noise nuisance	Prevention of public nuisance
13. Any external furniture not secured fixed to the ground shall be removed and stored securely and safety by 11pm	This is to reduce the opportunity for people to congregate in the area and the secure storage of freestanding furniture is to prevent such furniture being thrown or used as a weapon	Prevention of public nuisance and crime and disorder
14. The premises licence holder shall ensure that the provision of SIA doorstaff at the premises is appropriate to ensure the safe control of the premises and shall review this on a regular basis and upon request from GMP and or Stockport Council	The proposed condition does not mandate SIA doorstaff at any particular day/ time, it does however require Mr Watson to review whether door staff are needed at any particular time and if so that SIA registered doorstaff are used. A visit to the premises on 4 June revealed unlicensed doorstaff working at the premises. Unregistered doorstaff have not been subject to criminality checks and may undermine the licensing objectives, in that they may be unsuitable to carry out the role	Prevention of public nuisance Prevention of crime and disorder Protection of children from harm Public safety

The premises licence holder shall ensure that documented records of training are completed and kept for each member of staff (records can be disposed 6 weeks after the staff member has left employment at the premises). Training records should be signed by the staff member after each entry. Training records should be made available for inspection upon request by an authorised officer of Stockport Council or GMP	The provision of training and training records goes someway to demonstrating that staff have been provided with the necessary information to enable them to effectively carry out their roles.
