

**Refresh of Children and Young People's Mental Health Local Transformation Plan  
September 2021**

**Report of the Director of Integrated Commissioning  
NHS Stockport Clinical Commissioning Group**

## **1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT**

The purpose of this paper is to present to the Health and Wellbeing Board the re-freshed Children and Young People (CYP) Local Transformation Plan (LTP). Future in Mind: promoting, protecting and improving CYP's mental health and wellbeing was published by the Department of Health in 2015, and the first CCG LTP was published that year, signed off and approved by the Health and Wellbeing Board. Each year there has been a requirement for CCGs to publish a review or re-fresh of their plans.

The plan has been updated by the CCG in collaboration with key partners including Stockport Family and Pennine Care NHS Foundation Trust, Children and Adolescent Mental Health Services and our key stakeholders that are part of the Emotional Wellbeing and Mental Health Partnership.

The areas to note from the plan include:

- Achievements and developments – During 2020/21 the local partnership was successful in mobilising a single point of access for emotional wellbeing and mental health referrals; the successful procurement and mobilisation of an Early Help Offer; continued commissioning of Kooth.com and mobilisation of an all age mental health liaison offer for CYP who attend the Emergency Department.
- Performance against National and Local Standards – During 2020/21 the majority of national and local standards were achieved with the exception of the 12-week waiting time standard for first contacts (Contract performance standard).
- Identification of priority areas, taking into account the ambitions that did not progress as planned, for example improving waiting times for children and young people, progressing the mental health in education initiatives and developing a new pathway for neurodevelopmental disorders.

The LTP has been reviewed and approved by both Stockport Family Partnership Board and Stockport CCG Executive Board at their meetings on 13<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> October respectively.

## **2. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

The Borough Health and Care Plan has recommended the development of an All Age Mental Wellbeing Strategy working with communities, schools and businesses. The LTP will be a significant plan aligned to this strategy. Within the context of the Borough Plan it will be essential to widen the information captured in the plan to provide a comprehensive borough wide position to fully understand the mental health offer in order to improve the outcomes for CYP in Stockport.
