We will be carrying out a range of activities:

- To plant more bulbs in the flowerbed on Gatley Green
- To continue to maintain the flowerbeds on Gatley Green, Stonepail Road and on Church Rd
- To plant wild/naturalised bulb areas on Altrincham Road
- To put topsoil or compost on the flowerbed at Gatley Hill House
- To sew wildflower seeds in designated areas and to maintain these areas
- To fix more planters to the railings outside the Walter Stansby Gardens
- To put compost, plants and bulbs in the planters
- To put more 2 x large planters in prominent places in Gatley such as Gatley Green
- To fill the planters with compost and a mix of bulbs, perennial and annual plants
- To maintain the planters
- To clear litter in public areas
- To supply basic equipment to volunteers such as bulb planters, water carriers and trowels
- To restore 2 Lucy boxes on Stonepail Road and Lorna Grove

There are currently 7 members of the Gatley Flower Rangers, all residents of Gatley: myself,

The number of volunteers has grown due to the popularity of the project

We meet and work on the above activities at least once a month from April-November We have and will continue to have a watering rota during dry periods in order to maintain the health of the plants

We have had an overwhelmingly positive response from hundreds of Gatle

We have had an overwhelmingly positive response from hundreds of Gatley residents.

Our first activity was to replace the plants in 2 of the large planters at the end of Church Road. This involved taking out very deep- rooted but almost dead shrubs, adding new compost and plating annuals. I put this on Facebook. There were around 500 likes on this activity. Every activity that we have done since has attracted a similar response.

Thanks To Daryll Falconer of Stockport Council, we now have 6 more large planters in Gatley Village.

Many people stop to say thank you for what we are doing.

One man who has lived near Stonepail Road for many years said: 'it's never looked as good as this in all the 20 years that I have lived here'

Every resident and business will benefit from having a more pleasant environment in which to live and work.
