Redbrow Hollow - Proposed 'No Waiting At Any Time' Traffic Regulation Order (TRO)

Report of the Corporate Director for Place Management & Regeneration

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To report the findings of a consultation exercise and to seek approval for the introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO).

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1. The Network Management Section received a complaint highlighting concerns due to vehicles being parked fully on the pavement on Redbrow Hollow at its junction with Compstall Road. These vehicles were said to be obstructing the footway and causing safety concerns for motorists and pedestrians using the junction.
- 2.2. Traffic Services informed the Local Ward Councillors of the concerns raised following which, the Highway Ward Spokesperson, provided approval for this matter to be investigated further.

3. PROPOSALS

3.1. In order to resolve the issues, it is proposed to introduce a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) – 'No Waiting at Any Time' parking restrictions around the junction. The proposals are shown on **Drawing No. NM8-5051-01.**

4. LEGAL POSITION/IMPLICATIONS

4.1. The Traffic Management Orders would be made under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Council is required by the Local Authorities Traffic Order (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 to give notice of its intention to make a Traffic Order (by publishing a draft traffic order). These regulations also require the Council to consider any representations received as a result of publishing the draft Order.

- 6.1. The Local Ward Councillors have been consulted and no adverse comments were received.
- 6.2. From a total of 2 No. letters delivered to affected residents, we received 2 No. responses (100%), of which 2 No. (100%) fully support the proposals.

Following the consultation exercise, both residents highlighted the difficulties they currently face when trying to exit Redbrow Hollow and access Compstall Road.

Appendix A.

Proposed Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) Schedule

'No Waiting at Any Time'

Redbrow Hollow (Both Sides)

From the intersection of the southern kerb line of Compstall Road, for a distance of 10 meters in a south westerly direction.

Compstall Road (South West Side)

From a point, 16 meters south east of the intersection of the south eastern kerb line of Redbrow Hollow to a point, 10 meters north west of the intersection of the north western kerb line of Redbrow Hollow.
