6. Please describe the main activities of your Organisation/ Group

Stockport Samaritans help people at the lowest point of their lives. Our primary aim is to reduce the number of people who take their own lives.

We provide confidential, non-judgmental emotional support for those who are combatting distress and despair as well as suicidal feelings. People contact us by telephone or email because they know we listen. Our service is free and is now needed more than ever.

We are active in the local community through our outreach programme which includes raising the awareness of our service, particularly to those who need it most, and giving people guidance on how to look after their mental and emotional wellbeing. We are involved in SMBC's Suicide Prevention Strategy to work with other groups, both statutory and voluntary; we are partners with Stockport College and Pennine Care; we work with Stockport County FC and we give talks and presentations to local community groups, faith groups, schools and businesses, and we have provided support at railway stations and at local events, such as the annual 'Stockport Pride' Festival, Emergency Services Day and The Heatons Summer Festival.

We are:

Entirely autonomous and run entirely by volunteers - there are currently 111 volunteers who are ordinary, local people, highly trained to cope with the variety of calls that we receive;
Self-funded and need to raise £20,000 each year to keep our service operating – money is raised through grants and donations and our own fund-raising efforts.

9. Please give us a brief description of your proposed/planned project or activity

Suicide is the biggest killer of men under 50 and young people aged 20-34. Three quarters of all suicides are men. However, there is still a barrier to men seeking help when they are struggling to cope. Therefore, we are keen to reach out to men in their own environment. We have developed excellent links with Stockport County FC and have supported them with their work on men's mental health. We were fortunate during the pandemic last year to receive some generous donations which enabled us to sponsor two pitch-side spectator-facing banners at the club and to raise awareness of the service we provide. The Club will give us first refusal on these positions. The grant will fund the continued display of these banners for the 2022-23 season in these excellent positions and the purchase of the leaflets, cards and pens to share with fans when we attend matches.

10. Who will benefit from this grant?

Edgeley Park has a capacity of over 10,000 and matches attract fans - predominantly men from across the Borough. This presents a huge opportunity to reach our target audience. Stockport County FC is very active in the local community and our work with them focuses on men's mental health. Spectators will see our pitch-side banners, which were seen on TV during the recent FA Cup match.

By raising awareness and promoting our service at football matches, more people of all ages who are struggling to cope at one point or another in their lives would be able to benefit from the service we provide. This would be to the overall benefit to the mental wellbeing of Stockport citizens and hopefully would reduce the number of people who take their own lives.
