Report of the Corporate Director for Place Management & Regeneration

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

To approve No Waiting at Any Time restrictions at the junction of Criterion Street and Betley Road in Reddish.

2. BACKGROUND

Network Management received representation from the public about road safety at the said junction due to parking; in particular parked vehicles obstructing the footway on the radius adjacent to Spey House.

The south western arm of the junction is already protected with bollards and the eastern corners of the junction are quite wide; therefore in agreement with the Ward Councillors it was decided to move forward with a minimal proposal to protect the north western radius of the junction with double yellow line restrictions.

3. PROPOSALS

The proposed scheme is illustrated on attached drawing number: **NM8-5170-001**.

4. LEGAL POSITION/IMPLICATIONS

The Traffic Management Orders would be made under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Council is required by the Local Authorities Traffic Order (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 to give notice of its intention to make a Traffic Order (by publishing a draft traffic order). These regulations also require the Council to consider any representations received as a result of publishing the draft Order.

5. CONSULTATION

The consultation resulted in a single written response from a resident to support the scheme; and during a separate conversation, the duty manager at Spey House verbally confirmed his agreement with measures at this junction. No objections or adverse comments were returned during the consultation period.

6. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

7. TIMESCALES

It is expected that the order will become operative in 2022.
