Re: Licensing Act 2003 — Premises Licence

Carousel, The Carousel, 156-158 Reddish Road, South Reddish, Stockport, SK5 7HR

Please find enclosed the Premises Licence and Summary for the above premises. The hours stated apply from the date of this letter. Your attention is drawn to S57 (2) & (3) of the Licensing Act 2003, reproduced below:

(2) The holder of the premises licence must secure that the licence or a certified copy of it is kept at the premises in the custody or under the control of-

- (a) the holder of the licence, or
- (b) a person who works at the premises and whom the holder of the licence has nominated in writing for the purposes of this subsection.

(3) The holder of the premises licence must secure that-

- (a) the summary of the licence or a certified copy of that summary, and
- (b) a notice specifying the position held at the premises by any person nominated for the purposes of subsection (2), are **prominently** displayed at the premises

With this licence you are required to pay an Annual Fee each year on the Anniversary of the Grant of the Licence. You must do this for as long as you are the holder of the Licence. If you do not pay the Annual Fee your Licence may be suspended and you could face Court Action to recover the outstanding balance. If you sell the business, it is your responsibility to ensure the Licence is either surrendered or transferred. If you do not you remain liable for the fee and any activities.

The holder of the Premises Licence must ensure that a copy of the current plans is attached to the Premise Licence as stated in Section 24 of the Licensing Act. This should appear on Annex 4 of the Licence. The plans must be made available for inspection.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

Supervising the sale of alcohol

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Age related sales

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Minimum Price of Alcohol

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(1);
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
where
 - (i) **P** is the permitted price,
 - (ii) **D** is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) **V** is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(2).
3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Restrictions on drinks promotions

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Availability of drinking water

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Drinks measures to be provided

The responsible person must ensure that

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

The number of persons admitted to the premises during the time the premises are being used for the purposes for which this Licence is granted shall not exceed the stated number and a Notice must be displayed above the entrance of the premises as follows:

"The Maximum Occupancy for Regulated Entertainment is 150"

External windows and doors to be kept closed when music, singing and dancing are in progress and the level of noise emanating from the premises must not be such as to cause a nuisance to inhabitants of the neighbourhood. In any event the noise level must not exceed 35 d.b.a. at any boundary of the premises.

If a disc jockey is used on any night then he/she must ask customers to leave quietly.

CCTV cameras shall be in operation at all times that the premises are open to the public.

Notices will be displayed advising customers that a CCTV system is in operation.

All instances of crime and disorder will be reported to the police and will be kept in an incident log book.

Soft drinks and non-alcoholic refreshment will be available at all times the premises are open to the public.

A No-smoking area must be provided.

When regulated entertainment is taking place additional patrols will be made by staff, both internally and externally, to ensure that noise pollution is limited.

When children are allowed on the premises, any entertainment offered will be suitable for young persons.

Children will not be permitted on the premises unless they are accompanied by an appropriate adult
