Nicholson Street

Northern side from a point 10 metres East of the Eastern kerb line of Tunstall Street to a point 10 metres West of the Western kerb line of Tunstall Street.

Orders and subject to no objections being received within 21 days from the advertisement

Tunstall Street

Western side from the Northern kerb line of Nicholson Street for a distance of 6.2 metres in a Northerly direction (to tie-in with aforementioned).

Western side from a point 20 metres North of the Northern kerb line of Nicholson Street for a distance of 6.4 metres in a Northerly direction.

Western side from the Southern kerb line of Orphanage Street for a distance of 5 metres in a Southerly direction.

Eastern side from the Northern kerb line of Nicholson Street for a distance of approx. 49 metres in a Northerly direction to Orphanage Street.

Gordon Street

South East side from a point 10 metres South West of the South Western kerb line of Orphanage Street to a point 10 metres North East of the North Eastern kerb line of Orphanage Street.

Orphanage Street

Both sides from the South Eastern kerb line of Gordon Street in a Southerly direction (following the kerb line) for a distance of approx. 29 metres to the cul-desac end (to tie-in with the aforementioned on Gordon Street and Tunstall Road).

Blue Badge Holders Only

Tunstall Street

Western side from a point 26.4 metres North of the Northern kerb Line of Nicholson Street for a distance 6.6 metres in a Northerly direction.

Report of the Corporate Director for Place Management & Regeneration

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

To approve Traffic Regulation Orders (TRO's) as part of the new housing development adjacent to Gordon Street, Nicholson Street and Lancashire Hill in the Town Centre.

2. BACKGROUND

Members will be aware that construction has started on a new affordable housing development by Stockport Homes (DC/075512) off Lancashire Hill. The new build will comprise 16 No. 3 bedroom properties with associated parking available on a shared-ownership basis.

3. PROPOSALS

It would be prudent to implement the necessary TRO's at the first opportunity in readiness for the new properties being occupied. Therefore, for the purposes of traffic management and road safety, the following measures have been deemed necessary:

- Double yellow lines (No Waiting at Any Time) to prevent parking and obstruction on the Access Road within the development.
- Double yellow lines on the arms of the respective junctions into the development on Nicholson Street and Gordon Street.
- A mandatory parking bay for Blue Badge holders only as part of the Council's policy to create a welcoming environment for vulnerable road users.

4. LEGAL POSITION/IMPLICATIONS

The Traffic Management Orders would be made under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Council is required by the Local Authorities Traffic Order (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 to give notice of its intention to make a Traffic Order (by publishing a draft traffic order). These regulations also require the Council to consider any representations received as a result of publishing the draft Order.

5. CONSULTATION

As and when the TRO's are advertised, any completed properties and other local households / premises will receive a notification letter.

6. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The associated costs will be funded by the developer as part of the planning conditions (Section 106 Agreement).

7. TIMESCALES

The TRO's are expected to become operative in 2022 on completion of the development.
