The Darley Street Community Garden so far has been able to benefit from the enthusiasm and generosity of the Heaton Norris Community in terms of volunteer hours to clear the site including the removal of tree stumps and rubbish and then to plant over 300 donated bulbs and over 80 plants and shrubs. The lawn is being brought back to life and the site is litter picked on a regular basis.

We have now reached an important stage in our evolution of the garden and need external funding to put in place some crucial items to fulfil our adopted remit to create a community asset.

We need a water supply to the garden via rainwater collection as we cannot keep asking adjacent properties to do our watering in the long term. We wish to have some interpretation of the history of the land and the area via a public information board to tell the story of the garden within an important and historic Conservation Area and to recruit more supporters and volunteers. Signage and noticeboards are expensive items.

Additionally, there is a need to provide two raised beds with compost that will encourage children to tend one and the elderly/people with disabilities to garden more easily and safely,.

10. Who will benefit from this grant?

e.g. local residents, young people, older people and how?

Local people in Heaton Norris of all ages, backgrounds and ability/disability who want to help garden or just enjoy some lovely surroundings. We are already planning events: children on site making a Memory Tree and bunting for the Queen's Jubilee and taking part in The Heatons Open Gardens afternoon, Also ASDA has given us a chance to drive more interest, support and engagement through an Awareness Sunday this August which will be manned by our volunteers. From that we hope to gain more supporters and volunteers.

10(a) How Many Stockport residents will benefit?

Following a donated information/joining form campaign distributed to over 600 households by our local volunteers, it was notable that awareness, understanding and interest rose considerably in this project. Fifty residents signed up as supporters and plant donators and 22 for garden volunteering. These and more people from all over the area have donated over 300 bulbs and over 80 plants and shrubs. So we have been entirely self supporting to date.

10(b) Are there any restrictions on who will benefit from the funding?

None whatsoever. The garden is there for everyone to enjoy and hopefully respect.

11(a) How much will the project/activity cost in total?

It is very difficult to put a cost on the overall project as a garden is an ongoing process. Once mature, it will require care and maintenance.

The current project as outlined we estimate will cost £4,500. This bid is the first that we have made and it covers pressing needs re water supply, compost and also paint supplies to improve and clean the ginnel which forms the access point to the well used footpath from Bower Avenue. This is visible from the Green Lane/Alexandra Road entrance to the site and needs to be cleaned and brightened up. That forms the elements we are bidding for from the Ward Fund.

Our estimates are as follows:

Two tonnes of the best top soil	£150.00
Water butt and pipework plus a safety cage	£200.00
Fence and masonry paint plus brushes	£100.00

Total £450.00
