9. Please give us a brief description of your proposed/planned project or activityYou may wish to include details of what activities will take place, where will it happen, how often and who will take part. If you are applying for equipment you can tell us what will it be used for and why is it needed.

We would like to book in two days of educational workshops with a company called Hi-Impact. The workshops we would like are a music workshop and a robotics workshop. The team at Hi-impact would visit the nursery on two days in order for all children to access this (as the children attend different days of the week). On each day they would deliver a half day of music/music tech and a half day of robotics. These days come to a total of £600 each. We would also like to be able to add an additional session for these experts to work with our staff at the end of the school day to find ways of ensuring ICT and Music are incorporated into our curriculum and planning. These sessions are an additional £150 each, of which we would like two.

10. Who will benefit from this grant?

e.g. local residents, young people, older people and how?

The children in our nursery would benefit from these experiences greatly. ICT has now been removed from the Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage and we are trying to find new and innovative ways to incorporate ICT in to our teaching and learning curriculum. This is particularly challenging with our current financial status and funding difficulties. Understanding of the World and Expressive Arts and Design are not required to be formally assessed in the EYFS but this doesn't mean they are not important. We want to ensure that these are still very visible and relevant in our nursery as we feel creativity is such an important quality to promote especially with young children. The children entering our nursery in the next academic year are essentially "Covid babies", which means their experiences and opportunities have been limited during their short introduction to the world! We feel it is our responsibility as care givers and educators to provide experiences for these children which will directly impact their learning, well-being and development.
