Report of the Corporate Director for Place Management & Regeneration

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

To approve No Waiting at Any Time restrictions on part of Fulstone Mews in Heaviley.

2. BACKGROUND

Network Management received representation from a local Councillor acting on behalf of a resident. It was reported (with supporting evidence) that vehicles are parking over and obstructing the footway on that section (northern side) between the parking bays and the first build-out leading into the cul-de-sac.

3. PROPOSALS

In order to prevent this activity, a proposal was drafted to introduce No Waiting at Any Time restrictions (double yellow lines) on this section. Please see the attached drawing number: **NM8-5191-001**.

4. LEGAL POSITION/IMPLICATIONS

The Traffic Management Orders would be made under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Council is required by the Local Authorities Traffic Order (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 to give notice of its intention to make a Traffic Order (by publishing a draft traffic order). These regulations also require the Council to consider any representations received as a result of publishing the draft Order.

5. CONSULTATION

The local public consultation only resulted in a single response. The respondent stated the proposal was a good idea; but expects that motorists (who are non-residents) will only disrespect the restrictions and continue to park on this section.

In response Network Management would comment as follows: In the absence of parking restrictions an obstruction on the footway would be a matter for GM Police; however the Police only have limited resources to deal with this type of offence and the person(s) being obstructed needs to be willing to make a statement to that effect. On the other hand, double or single yellow line restrictions offer a visual impact and can be enforced directly by Council Officers. Note: The legal order for these restrictions applies from the middle of the carriageway to the back of the footway and therefore a vehicle(s) obstructing the footway can be ticketed.

6. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Legal and Advertising £560 Road Lining £140

7. TIMESCALES

If approved the order is expected to become operative in 2022.
