a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 11)

We will adhere to the challenge 25 policy. A refusals record must be kept at the premises which details all refusals to sell alcohol. This record must include the date and time of the incident, the name of the staff member who refused the sale, and the reason the sale was refused. All entries must be made within 24 hours of the refusal.

All deliveries of alcohol shall only be delivered to a premises address with a valid postcode and will only be delivered directly to that property.

At all times that the premises are open to the public for licensable activities, all staff on-duty at the premises, including all door supervisors, and all on-duty managers must have completed Action Counters Terrorism (ACT) Awareness e-learning training.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

For any special or larger outdoor events we will hire an SIA badged door staff.

The dispersal of customers from the premises must be managed in accordance with the following:

Clear and legible notices must be prominently displayed at all exits requesting customers to respect local residents and leave the area quietly.

Public announcements requesting customers to leave quietly to minimise disturbance to nearby residents

A 20 minute period where music volume is reduced / lighting increased

A suitable member of staff to remind people to leave quietly, and to prevent patrons from reentering the premises, and shall deter customers from using private hire vehicles without a prior booking

All drinks and glass vessels must be removed from patrons as they leave to ensure no glass leaves the premises.

Any and all of the following incidents must be noted including pertinent details and, as appropriate, reported promptly so that investigations can be made and action taken (delete as appropriate):

alleged crimes reported to the venue or by the venue to the police
ejections of patrons complaints received incidents of
disorder
seizures of drugs, offensive weapons, fraudulent ID or other items
faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
refusal of the sale of alcohol
visit by a responsible authority or emergency service
the times on duty, names and the licence numbers of all licensed door
supervisors employed by the premises. suspicious behaviour by patrons or members
of the public close to a venue.

c) Public safety

We will install an 8 camera CCTV system

CCTV cameras are located within the premises to cover all public areas including all entrances and exits [The location of ground floor cameras specified in pink on the plan attached to the premises licence]

The system records clear images permitting the identification of individuals

The CCTV system is able to capture a minimum of 24 frames per second and all recorded footage must be securely retained for a minimum of 28 days

The CCTV system operates at all times while the premises are open for licensable activities [Insert: or specify timings]

All staff on duty at the premises shall be trained in the Emergency and Evacuation procedures for the premises and aware of their individual responsibilities.

The premises shall display prominent signage indicating that it is an offence to sell alcohol to anyone who is drunk.

A Personal Licence holder must be present at the premises to supervise all sales of alcohol.

All public facing staff must be clear about what to do if the public report suspicious activity or unusual behaviour to them. Any and all suspicious behaviour by customers or members of the public close to the venue must be noted and be reported promptly so that investigations can be made and action taken, if appropriate.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

We will make sure all patrons leaving are aware of the importance of being quiet for our neighbours with adequate signage and supervision. In most circumstances we do not often expect to be open past 22.30 as the area is very quiet by that time.

All external windows and doors must be kept shut at all times when regulated entertainment is being provided. Doors may be opened for normal entrance and egress of people but must be shut immediately thereafter.

A noise limiting device must be installed and must operate at all times regulated entertainment takes place at the premises. The device must be of a type, in a location and set at a level

e) The protection of children from harm

Where children are allowed on the premises, information shall be displayed to the staff at the Strines Nightingale Public House - on what to do if there is a cause for concern regarding a child's welfare. This shall include reporting to Manchester City Council via its Contact Centre on 0161 234 5000 or mcsreply@manchester.gov.uk, or the NSPCC on 0808 800 5000 (free 24hour service) or dialling 999 in the event of an immediate threat.

A new planter / barrier system will run alongside Strines Road to create a safe enclosure around the front door and terraces to prevent breakaway children and dogs from accidentally straying into the main road.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community

premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

- any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
 - Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
