# Proposed Traffic Regulation Order 'No Waiting At Any Time' on Cross Lane, Marple

# Report of the Director for Place Management

#### 1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To report the findings of a consultation exercise and to seek approval for the introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO).

#### 2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1. Traffic Services received a request from the Local Highway Ward Spokesperson to investigate concerns relating to motorists parking their vehicle on Cross Lane just after the junction with Stockport Road.
- 2.2. Vehicles parked at this location can hinder traffic movement for motorists attempting to access and egress between Stockport Road and Cross Lane.

#### 3. PROPOSALS

- 3.1. Due to the nature of the concerns, Traffic Services propose to introduce a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) 'No Waiting At Any Time' (double yellow lines), these proposals are shown on **Drawing No: NM8-4061-01.**
- 3.2. The existing Access Protection Mark (APM) will need to be removed in order to extend the double yellow lines.

#### 4. LEGAL POSITION/IMPLICATIONS

4.1. The Traffic Management Orders would be made under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Council is required by the Local Authorities Traffic Order (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 to give notice of its intention to make a Traffic Order (by publishing a draft traffic order). These regulations also require the Council to consider any representations received as a result of publishing the draft Order.

### 5. CONSIDERATION OF ALTERNATIVE SOLUTIONS

5.1. No other alternatives were considered.

#### 6. CONSULTATION

- 6.1. The Local Ward Councillors have been consulted and no adverse comments were received.
- 6.2. Greater Manchester Police have been consulted and no adverse comments were received.
- 6.3. Affected residents were consulted with.

From a total of 16 properties consulted with 5 (31%) responses were received. Of those responses 5 (100%) were in favour of the proposals.

## Comments made by those in support of the proposals:

It will be a lot better if the yellow lines were to be extended, the entrance to the car park at the back isn't that wide so consequently if cars park close to the entrance it makes it difficult to get out.

Very difficult pulling out of the car park at the rear of the flats because of parked cars on Cross Lane. I part pull out while cars are whizzing onto Cross Lane from Stockport Road, also pedestrians trying to cross at the same time. Only a matter of time before accidents occur.

In favour of the proposals being extended. Difficultly at present getting in and out of Capstone Drive due to cars parked on Cross Lane.

This is long overdue. This is a dangerous junction.
