<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Highlight progress with the Provider Partnership in identifying the outcomes the partnership will focus on improving.
Key points (Executive Summary):
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Provider Partnership had initially conducted workstreams in line with previous commissioning strands of work. As the Integrated Care Systems (ICS) has continued to develop, some of the workstreams have now established reporting mechanisms into Greater Manchester (GM) boards. To prevent duplication, and to focus on the key health outcome indicators requiring improvement in the Stockport, including Diabetes, Alcohol, Falls and Frailty.

1.0 Purpose

- 1.1 The purpose of this flash report is to update the Locality Board on the areas of focus for the Provider Partnership.
- 1.2 The Provider Partnership will bring together a range of providers from across Stockport's Health and Care economy to focus on improving outcomes in a number of chosen areas.

2.0 Provider Partnership Outcomes

2.1 The Provider Partnership will work under the following Locality Board Priorities:

- A. Overall – healthy life expectancy and inequalities
- B. Infant mortality
- C. Child development at 2.5yrs
- D. % of young people Not in Education, Employment or Training (NEET)
- E. Physical activity levels children and adults
- F. Households in poverty
- G. Housing and homelessness
- H. Smoking inequality between vulnerable groups and general population
- I. Age of onset of multimorbidity
- J. Falls / frailty prevalence
- K. Dementia prevalence
- L. Alcohol related harm

2.2 The priorities were discussed at a small workshop of providers on 25th April 2023. The providers selected the following outcome areas to focus on within the provider partnership over the next 12 months:

- Diabetes Pathways / Outcomes
- Falls
- Frailty
- Alcohol Related Harm

2.3 The provider partnership will focus on prevention in collaboration with public health colleagues It is acknowledged that this will:

- Produce better health outcomes (happy, healthy lives) for the people we serve
- Address inequalities in health outcomes
- Be cheaper and/or more cost effective than treatment
- Manage demand for high acuity/specialist care

3.0 Next Steps

3.1 In the areas identified (diabetes, falls, frailty and alcohol related harm), work has commenced in May 2023 to review the following for the Stockport locality:

- Outcome measures and indicators, at neighbourhood level where possible.
- Scope existing work ongoing in the system in relation to these areas.
- Review evidence bases and best practice guidance in relation to these areas.
- Identify actions to be considered for making improvements to outcomes and indicators.

3.2 The Terms of Reference for the provider partnership are also due for review and this will be undertaken in June 2023.

3.5 It is recommended that the One Stockport Health and Care Board endorse the approach and areas of focus suggested for the Provider Partnership.
