# Installation of Pedestrian Guardrail on Woodford Road, Woodford

# Report of the Director for Place Management

### 1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To seek approval for the installation of pedestrian guardrail on Woodford Road next to the A555 access point.

### 2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1. Reports have been received of a vehicle which is being continually parked on Woodford Road, Woodford at the access point to the A555.
- 2.2. This vehicle is parking half on the footway and half on the carriageway causing an obstruction for pedestrians and motorists alike, as demonstrated within the image below.



- 2.3. This vehicle is also hindering visibility for drivers and pedestrians using the crossing point.
- 2.4. Following discussions with the local ward councillors, Network Management Officers carried out extensive investigations following which, the vehicle was observed parked at the location daily.
- 2.5. Network Management have continued to monitor the location, as and when Officers are in the area, with the vehicle observed to be continuing to park at the location.

2.6. Network Management have sent a letter to the driver of the vehicle; this was posted by hand on 18<sup>th</sup> April 2023. The letter highlighted to the driver the safety concerns that had been raised due to the location the vehicle was being parked and asked them to seek alternative parking arrangements. However, to date the driver of the vehicle continues to park at the location.

### 3. PROPOSALS

3.1. To resolve the concerns raised, and to ensure that both the footway and carriageway at this location remain free from parked vehicles, it is proposed to install 14 metres of pedestrian guardrail. The proposals are shown on **Drawing No. NM8-Woodford Road156a-01**.

### 4. CONSULTATION
