9. Please give us a brief description of your proposed/planned project or activity You may wish to include details of what activities will take place, where will it happen, how often and who will take part. If you are applying for equipment you can tell us what will it be used for and why is it needed.

The VCSE sector, together with lots of other sectors, groups & individuals is affected by the Cost of Living challenges, and rising costs are squeezing the viability of organisations and adding pressure on ever escalating costs.

Fortunately we have a couple of years peppercorn rent from Northern Rail, however opening a new community base, with meeting rooms, access to training and support for diverse VCSE start up and scale up organistions (over 80% of which are women led) brings additional costs. Moving into the space, with various electrical items, we realise we have to PAT test all electricals as a mandatory condition for health/safety/risk management and to comply with insurance.

It costs £0.80-£1.50 per item to PAT test items and many VCSE organisations in our network are having to incur these costs. We aim to train 2 local people – 1 person under 20 and one over 70 years of age, to offer accessible & affordable PAT testing for community groups, charities and social enterprises – running a not for private profit service to aid the Hub, those connected to it and the wider VCSE sector across Stockport.

#### 10. Who will benefit from this grant?

e.g. local residents, young people, older people and how?

1 person under 20 and 1 person over 70 will be trained in PAT testing and we can use a PAT testing machine we have access to – this will be an intergenerational training activity and service developing skills with both young and old.

#### 10(a) How Many Stockport residents will benefit?

There are 1,388 VCSE organisations in Stockport according to the State of the Sector and potentially all or at least 10-30% will be targeted as we have significant relationships and partnerships with Sector 3 the VCSE support agency for Stockport already. Local community groups and local residents can also bring in items to be PAT tested for both personal, work & community use and items will be PAT tested below the current costs at £0.25-£0.50p per item to raise resources to sustain the service (marketing/training/stickers/equipment/overheads).

We expect 10-15 individuals/groups/organisations a month to benefit so more than 100 per year

### 10(b) Are there any restrictions on who will benefit from the funding?

It will be community groups/VCSE organisations as the priority and target group.

### 11(a) How much will the project/activity cost in total?

Training Costs for 2 people @£225 each = £450 (seeking from fund)

Travel costs for the volunteers £15pp = £30 (resourced by Flourish)

Marketing and promotion of service flyers/graphics/Media £150 (resourced by Flourish)

PAT testing machines and starter kit materials cost £399.00 inc VAT (borrowed from another charity in the short term we will seek to buy our own as demand increases)

TOTAL: £1029.00

Postcode lottery money will cover initial overheads and over time we will use resources raised to buy our own PAT testing machines – initially we can borrow a PAT testing machine from a charity in Trafford who already have one.
