### Date of meeting 13 June 2023 Summary of updates provided during meeting

- High Level Risk Report for system quality risks to be included going forward to support system oversight & collaborative working.
- Review of Terms of Reference to note that the Stockport Quality Strategy also covers nursing homes and adult social care and is a System Strategy
- Exception updates provided for:
  - o The Priory
  - Pennine Care NHS Foundation Trust
  - Pharmacy Update
  - Junior Doctor strikes
  - End of Life Care Project that has been agreed to commence at the Trust around supporting people to die in preferred place.
- Suicide Prevention Deep Dive presentation.

### **Key decisions taken**

There is an expectation that any additions to the Stockport Quality Risk Report be replicated across each organisation's risk register.

Further workshop to be arranged for September 2023 to discuss key objectives of the Group & our quality priorities for the next 12 months.

Representatives from Pennine Care NHS Foundation Trust & Stockport Public Health Team provided an overview of suicide prevention resources and encouraged members to share amongst colleagues. Copies of the slide to be shared with GP practices.

## Matters referred to the Locality Board for approval, debate or further consideration

Following the workshop due to be held in September the groups agreed priorities for the next twelve months will be brought to board for approval.

# Risks and mitigations raised

No update regarding vacant pharmacy franchise in Sainsbury stores in Stockport.

Reduced provision of out of hours pharmacies in Stockport; patients having to travel further to obtain prescriptions. The issue could also exacerbate existing conditions. Issue has been escalated to NHS England via Primary Care Delivery Board and Stockport Locality Board.
