Purpose of the report:

This is a briefing paper to update Locality Board on the plans, priorities and progress for the Neighbourhoods and Prevention Programme in Stockport.

Key points (Executive Summary):

- The Neighbourhoods and Prevention Programme is recognised as the key to unlocking the benefits of collaborative working with communities and partner organisations to actively identify local issues and problem solve together with the aim of early identification of need with effective evidence based self-help or early intervention. This priority area is underpinning the success of our locality strategy, the One Health and Care Plan. We recognise that we have increased complexity of need at an earlier age and as our population grows and ages, more people are developing complex care needs and requiring support from multiple health and care services. Partners in Stockport recognise that people are more than just their health conditions or care needs and require an individual personalised and asset-based approach to respond to emerging needs.
- We will work together as ONE System through a new neighbourhood model that recognises wider factors such as education, housing, employment, environment, and social connectedness to put people at the heart of our services and tailor care to their individual needs by creating the conditions for individuals, communities, services and professionals to work together. Focusing on creating the conditions for good lives, empowering people to stay healthy and supporting people to return to health in their neighbourhoods.
- The vision for the programme is to bring services from across the borough together to enable a Healthy and Happy Stockport.
- The Neighbourhoods and Prevention Programme is comprised of four pillars of work, each interdependent with the other with clear individual focus aligned to the overarching vision of the programme.
 - One Neighbourhoods Model
 - Thriving Places
 - Connected Communities
 - Collaborative Health & Care
- A third workshop is planned for Friday 10th November 2023 which will see us move from agreeing our vision, developing our programme and our pillars to implementation. We will move from principles to practice; the third workshop will focus on delivery and how we can accelerate progress in those four pillars.

Following the third Workshop in November, a Neighbourhoods & Prevention Programme Board will be put in place chaired by the Executive Director of People and Integration.
