Addition of Right Turn Arrow on Berrycroft Lane, Bredbury

Report of the Director of Place Management

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To present the findings of a study carried out by Urban Traffic Control (UTC) part of Transport for Greater Manchester (TfGM) on the addition of a right turn filter arrow from Berrycroft Lane to Barrack Hill

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1. Traffic Services received a request from the Local Highway Ward Spokesperson to investigate the possibility of adding a right turn arrow to assist with traffic flow, specifically turning from Berrycroft Lane to Barack Hill.
- 2.2. As permanent traffic signals are managed and controlled by UTC at TfGM, they were commissioned to carry out a Traffic Impact Report to determine if the right turn filter arrow would be feasible and of benefit for this junction.
- 2.3. The results of the modelling indicate that the addition of a right turn arrow on Berrycroft Lane would reduce the delay experienced for right turning vehicles in the AM and PM peak periods by 7.3s and 7.4s per vehicle, respectively.
- 2.4. The study was presented at Werneth Area Committee on 17th April 2023 and Ward Councillors requested further studies into the effect on traffic flow if a second right turn arrow was installed coming from School Brow onto George Lane.
- 2.5. The results of the second study indicate that the addition of a right turn arrow on School Brow would likely have an adverse impact on the operation of the junction during the evening peak period (the morning peak performs more favourably).
- 2.6. There are likely to be significant increases to queuing and delay on Barrack Hill and Berrycroft Lane during the evening peak, albeit with significant reductions to right turn delay on School Brow (6.9 and 19.2 seconds per vehicle during the morning and evening peaks)
- 2.7. Ward Councillors therefore requested to proceed with the original request of a right turn arrow from Berrycroft Lane onto Barrack Hill, and to monitor the traffic flow after installation.
- 2.8. Full TfGM reports attached.

3. PROPOSALS

3.1. To install right turn filter arrow from Berrycroft Lane onto Barrack Hill, and associated works.

4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1. <u>Installation of right turn arrow and associated works</u> £5,000

To be funded by the Bredbury Green & Romiley delegated ward budget.

5. TIMESCALES

5.1. 8-12 weeks
