Purpose of the report:

To outline partnership activity between April 2022 and March 2023.

Key points (Executive Summary):

Our vision: is 'working in partnership to support and safeguard the people of Stockport to enable them to live safe, healthy and, where possible, independent lives'.

The vision of the adults and children's safeguarding partnership is translated into a joint action plan through a three-year Strategic Plan underpinned by a Business Plan which is reviewed and refreshed annually. The current Strategic Plan (2023-26) was agreed in June 2023. It is based on five priorities:

- 1. Improve partnership working and information sharing,
- 2. effective transitions from childhood to adulthood,
- 3. understanding complex trauma and assessing risk,
- 4. working with men and working with adults to manage risk effectively
- 5. making safeguarding personal.

Key activity over the previous period includes:

- The learning hub model is embedded in the partnership
- Action plans have been embedded from Child Safeguarding Practice Reviews (CSPR's) and Rapid Reviews (RR's).
- The partnership is making progress together
- The new business plan priorities have been launched
- Assurance activity continues to take place to assure the board that practice is improving.
