Purpose of the report:

To receive the Better Care Fund (BCF) 2023 – 25 Quarter 2 Reporting Template for ahead of the deadline for submission to NHS England which is 31 October 2023.

Key points (Executive Summary):

- The Better Care Fund (BCF) is one of the government's national vehicles for driving health and social care integration. It requires integrated care boards (ICBs) and local government to agree a joint plan, owned by the health and wellbeing board (HWB). These are joint plans for using pooled budgets to support integration, governed by an agreement under section 75 of the NHS Act (2006).
- Stockport submitted the BCF Planning Submission 2023 25 in line with the national conditions in June 2023 (following approval by the Health and Wellbeing Board on 14 June 2023).
- As part of this submission ambitions and plans for performance against BCF national metrics were included alongside a Capacity & Demand Template detailing the anticipated demand and planned capacity for different types of support for the financial year 2023/24.
- The Quarter 2 Reporting Template gives Stockport the opportunity to refresh the submitted capacity and demand plans, alongside providing information on challenges, achievements and support needs.
- The metrics around unscheduled admissions, falls, discharge destination, residential admissions and reablement are on track to meet the targets set in June 2023.
- The review of the Capacity & Demand Template submitted in June 2023 has indicated that the estimates for demand and plans for capacity remain consistent with the figures submitted earlier in the year. Our ongoing analysis of the demands on the system will continue to inform our iterative planning.
- There has been some increased demand in our reablement capacity which was highlighted as a challenge. Additional investment and recruitment has provided some additional capacity.
- Age UK have been able to introduce flexibility into their Pathway 0 support offer to manage the additional demand that the system is seeing for people who are seeking to remain at home or return home following a hospital stay.

 Other projected demands and capacity to address them remain consistent with the original projections and there is proposed investment through the Urgent and Emergency Care Support Grant around Technology Enabled Care and the infrastructure to support prompt assessment and flow through the system.
