Purpose of the report:

These are:

- The State of the Borough

These will inform the next phase of the borough plan One Stockport, One Future. They also play a crucial role in development and delivery of the One Health and Care plan.

Both will be published on our open data portal – <u>Big Stockport Picture.</u>
This means that they can be used widely by partners the Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise Sector and local communities. They will provide a powerful evidence base for interventions and opportunities to attract grants and external income.

1. Background

One Stockport Health and Care Board is committed to use good quality data, intelligence and insight to inform decision making. This report provides an update on two key pieces of work that has been developed to ensure that data and intelligence is at the heart of strategy and transformation in Stockport. These are "The State of the Borough" and "Neighbourhood profiles".

This work will inform the development of the next phase of the borough plan One Stockport, One Future. They also play a crucial role in the development and delivery of the One Health and Care plan.

Both pieces of work have been developed in collaboration with partners from across Stockport and Greater Manchester.

2. State of the Borough

The State of the Borough gives an annual picture of the borough. It provides a summary of key census data and metrics against the priorities set out in the One Stockport Borough Plan. It also summarises key pieces of intelligence that have been undertaken such as the Joint Strategic Needs Assessment. The report is included as in Appendix 1.

The data contained within the report provides important information that can be used by the Voluntary, Community Faith and Social Enterprise Sector and other partners and will be published on our open data portal – <u>Big Stockport Picture</u>. It helps to shape our priorities and steer conversations across the borough, with partner organisations, community groups and residents.

The State of the Borough report is not a performance report and therefore service activity data is limited, unless it is helpful in showing changing needs/outcomes.

These metrics should be underpinned by more granular priority metrics monitored by the relevant Strategic Partnership Board or Leadership Group to support impact assessment of the delivery of the associated strategies and plans.

The performance metrics within the report have been identified by the Senior Responsible Owners and Delivery Leads for the domain.


This report is broken into chapters to align it with <u>Stockport Borough Plan</u> with a 9 page executive summary of Stockport in numbers followed by more detailed analysis of each domain within the Borough Plan.

3. Neighbourhood Profiles

Neighbourhood Profiles have been developed as part of the Neighbourhoods and Prevention programme to inform local priorities and delivery.

The Neighbourhood Profile is a dashboard that allows users to view key measures for Stockport by its seven neighbourhood. This is currently in a prototype phase, and has been shared with partners to gather feedback and to further develop and iterate. The following snapshot images of the interactive site illustrate the drill down functionality of the visualisation tool. Measures include demographics, Public Health/Health Lifecycle measures, Stockport as a Place, Economy and Income.



4. Next Steps

Following feedback from the One Health and Care Board, The State of the Borough will be shared as part of the engagement that will take place over the next 3 months on One Stockport, One Future.

A range of further communication and engagement activity is planned to showcase the work with key stakeholders. It will also be shared with all of Stockport's Strategic Partnership Boards that have ownership for delivery.

The Neighbourhood Profiles were shared at the last Neighbourhoods and Prevention workshop on 10th November and partners have been asked for feedback to further shape their development.
