2. About Your Application

9. Please give us a brief description of your proposed/planned project or activity

We are opening a new guide unit for Heald Green, given the lack of opportunities currently available in the area. We already have girls on our list to start in January 2024. Guides is a relaxed, welcoming space where 10-14 year old girls can have fun and be themselves. They will explore things they love and do things they've never done before. They'll learn life skills and embark on adventure weekends away, really giving them the confidence, self-esteem and belief in themselves to take them into adulthood. Our group is all about promoting and advancing social welfare in young girls in our local community – whilst we are not open to boys, there are quite a few local scout groups in our area which are well established and self-funded. Once we are established, we hope we can give back to our community in a way that generates some fundraising for us, and we will have more of a turnover of income to manage outgoings and will be self-sufficient.

10. Who will benefit from this grant?

Young girls aged 10-14 in Heald Green village and surrounding areas, and their families.

10(a) How Many Stockport residents will benefit?

Our maximum numbers might be around 24 when we are established.

10(b) Are there any restrictions on who will benefit from the funding?

Girlguiding is not open to boys, but there are plenty of Cubs, Beavers and Scouts units in the area.

11. Your Project's Budget

11(a) How much will the project/activity cost in total?

We are requesting a grant of £500 to cover initial running costs for the unit. We are applying for this grant as we are a new Unit and are starting from scratch with no resources. Every March we will have to pay around £47 per guide to head office to cover our membership and all insurances necessary for the unit. We will also pay £10 per meeting to rent the hall space from the Church, which is payable once a term. We also have outgoings to run meetings and provide weekly resources for the planned activities. Things the local Brownie Unit have done recently (just as an example of costs that the unit will outlay for the guides that join us) include making lip balms, candles, wax food wraps, bonfire biscuits, apple bobbing, bulb and seed planting, making bath bombs, conducting experiments with vinegar and bicarb etc. There are lots of weekly resources that we need to pay for out of subs monies left over after deductions.

11(b) Tell us about other any other sources of income you have already applied for or raised so far in relation to this project

We applied for a grant from the Manchester Airport Community Trust Fund on 15/11/23 for £700 to cover equipment for a unit start up such as a first aid kit, lots of crafting resources and crafting equipment.

12(a) If the amount you are applying for covers only part of the project/activity, then please tell us how do you intend to fund any shortfall?

Our guide unit will give back to our local community, and the resources we need to start operating will help us do that. For example, projects that other local Rainbows, Brownies and Guide units organise to give back to the community include: weeding and planting bulbs in local planters in the village, for all the community to enjoy; an event for all girls and their families, friends or neighbours, to get together as a local community and fundraise to hopefully support a local activity centre under threat of closure; organising and collecting donations for our community foodbanks during Harvest and Christmas. We aim to inspire the girls to plan, prepare, create and craft things to give back to the community, whether as gifts to family and friends or to offer at other events for everyone in our community such as at the village christmas markets, or organised social events such as summer fairs or bonfire events. The aim will be that the girls' subs and income from other fundraising activities in the local community will be sufficient to keep our unit operating, once we are established.
