6. Please describe the main activities of your Organisation/ Group

Sustainable Living in the Heatons (SLH) was established 13 years ago as a local, volunteer-led organisation with a broad remit to make the 4 Heatons a better place to live now and for future generations. The focus is on environmental issues, which include an eclectic mix of activities and events to suit all ages and interests.

Over the years these have included:

- development of raised beds in public areas for growing herbs and vegetables;
- a series of evening bat walks in spring and late summer, since 2021;
- planting and maintenance of a community orchard;
- local volunteer-led cycle rides for families and those lacking confidence on the bike;
- layering and maintenance of an ancient hedge to encourage wildlife;
- hedgehog monitoring;
- swap shops;
- energy awareness events;
- food waste banquets;
- stalls at a range of local events with environmental themes and activities;
- promotion of, and organising Heatons Climate Action Festival in September 2020. https://www.slheatons.org/heatons-climate-action-festival/programme/
- organising awareness-raising events as *Low Carbon Heatons*, with funding from Stockport Climate Action Now (CAN);
- setting up the Heatons Repair Café which started October 2023, in collaboration with Heatons' Men in Sheds, St Pauls' Church and other local volunteers;

SLH has a core group of volunteers, and a wider membership list of several hundred people who join in with specific activities. We have close and active links with other local groups and are recognised as being an important part of the community in the Heatons.

This application is for funding for wood to mend and strengthen the damaged sides of the raised herb bed in Heaton Moor.

We built the first SLH raised bed outside Blue Corn/the Co-op in the centre of Heaton Moor in 2013, and other beds have followed in different parts of the Heatons. Our plan was to build a community garden where shoppers could pick up herbs for their next meal while doing their shopping. It could be an easy, cheap, plastic-free way to obtain common herbs. We also thought that local people could see how easy it is to grow herbs and be inspired to grow their own.

Since being built the bed has become an eye catching focal point in the middle of the shops. When the SLH team get together to tend the plot, passers-by to stop, talk, discuss the herbs and comment on the bed. People come with their scissors to clip herbs to take home. Local shopkeepers and residents have watered it during the heat of the summer. We've labelled the herbs in different ways over the years, but always our aim has been to show that the herbs are there for everyone to pick as they need. The raised bed is maintained by SLH team and other interested local people who weed, plant, prune, and feed the herbs.

General wear and tear, as well as people sitting on the sides, has weakened the bed. We have patched it to stop it collapsing, but some of the wood needs replacing with stronger wood. We have a volunteer team who will do the work this winter 2023/4. We need to obtain strong, good quality hard wood.

We are putting in the application now because we want to avoid the bed collapsing this winter.
