Tree Preservation Order 329-351 Wilmslow Road, Heald Green

Report of the Director of Development and Regeneration

1. MATTER FOR CONSIDERATION

1.1 Consideration of proposed Tree Preservation Order (TPO), following site visit on Wednesday 27th September 2023.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 The attention of the Council was first drawn to the site earlier this year by residents adjacent to the site, who were concerned about the on-going removal of trees and degradation of the site as a wildlife habitat.
- 2.2 Following an initial site visit by the Council's arboriculture officer on 9th March 2023, a TPO was considered expedient in the interests of amenity for the preservation of twenty-two trees on the site.
 - 2.2.1 The TPO was made on the 4th of May 2023, from which date it came into provisional effect for a period of 6 months.
 - 2.2.2 Upon serving the original notice, it was noted that several trees had been removed and others misidentified, so an amendment was proposed to the original TPO.
- 2.3 The Council received two objections to the TPO:

Objection 1

2.3.1 The first objection was raised to the inclusion of the Spruce tree, originally T18, now T15. The objector is concerned that the tree may be in an unsafe condition and could fall onto the adjacent properties.

Objection 2

- 2.3.2 The second objection was raised by the landowner who objected to the protection of trees on their land. The key points of the objection, as highlighted by their solicitor, are summarised below:
 - The TPO was put in place on the basis of a malicious attempt by a neighbour to prevent the landowner from exercising their right to sell the property.
 - ii. It is the intention of the landowner to sell the property to a developer for the purpose of building residential accommodation and it is contended that the need for local housing outweighs the benefit of protecting the trees.
 - iii. The landowner is not aware of any specific habitats or protected species on the land that would need to be protected by a TPO.
 - iv. Most of the trees on the land in question are non-deciduous pine trees or willows of limited environmental benefit.

- 2.4 The landowner also raised concerns regarding the vulnerability and height of some of the trees and their proximity to neighbouring properties, specifically trees T4 Birch, T15 Spruce, T16 Spruce and T17 Ash. These four trees have been inspected as part of the assessment process and the arboriculture officer is satisfied that they are typical of the age and species and do not pose a heightened risk.
- 2.5 Response to the objections:

Objection 1

2.5.1 It is the assessment of the Council's arboriculture officer that the tree is healthy and free from significant structural defect and so should remain on the TPO.

Objection 2

- 2.5.2 The responses to the objections of the landowner are as follows:
 - i. The basis for the TPO, as made, is that it appears to the Council that it is expedient in the interests of amenity to make provision for the preservation of the trees on the site.
 - ii. Any potential impact on the sale or development of land affected by the TPO is not a relevant legal consideration in the making of a TPO.
 - iii. There is inherent wildlife value to the site as the trees provide food and shelter for the native wildlife, the conservation of which is considered expedient in the interests of amenity.
 - iv. It is considered that the individual, collective and wider impact of the trees are such that there is an amenity value to the trees, including the environmental and climate benefits of the group of trees.
- 2.5.3 It is the assessment of the Council's arboriculture officer that the trees identified by the landowner are typical of their age and species and do not pose a heightened risk to the adjacent properties.
- 2.6 Following the receipt of objections, and in line with statutory procedure, the TPO was referred to the Cheadle Area Committee to allow all objections to be considered before a decision to confirm the TPO was made.
- 2.7 At the September meeting of the Cheadle Area Committee, when the item was being discussed, it was decided that the Council's legal team should be consulted over the protracted decision making to ensure continued compliance with the statutory procedure and for a site visit by Councillors to take place to enable the Councillors to see the trees first hand.
- 2.8 The site visit took place on 27th September 2023 and was attended by Cheadle Area Committee members, the Council's arboriculture officer, the owner of the land and their tree consultant. Each tree subject to the proposed TPO was considered individually on its own merits and as part of the community of trees on the site, with both the Council's arboriculture officer and the landowner's consultant providing comments on each tree.

2.9 To ensure compliance with statutory procedure, the Council considered it would be best to allow the TPO to lapse and for a new TPO to be made against which any outstanding objections to the original TPO could be duly considered.

The new TPO was made on the 2nd November 2023, with an amended schedule of trees for preservation (to reflect the removal of several trees by the landowner between the Council's initial site visit and the making of the original TPO).

3. CONCLUSION

3.1 It is considered that the trees on site are worthy of protection and there is likely to be a threat of removal if they remain unprotected.

4. RECOMMENDATION

4.1 That the Committee resolves to confirm the TPO (as amended) [as shown at appendix 2]





Town and Country Planning Act 1990

The Metropolitan Borough Council of Stockport Tree Preservation (329-351 Wilmslow Road, Heald Green) (2) Order 2023

The Metropolitan Borough Council of Stockport in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 198 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 make the following Order—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as The Metropolitan Borough Council of Stockport Tree Preservation (329-351 Wilmslow Road, Heald Green) (2) Order 2023.

Interpretation

- 2.1. In this Order "the authority" means the Metropolitan Borough Council Stockport.
- 2.2. In this Order any reference to a numbered section is a reference to the section so numbered in the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and any reference to a numbered regulation is a reference to the regulation so numbered in the Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation)(England) Regulations 2012.

Effect

- 3.1 Subject to article 4, this Order takes effect provisionally on the date on which it is made.
- 3.2. Without prejudice to subsection (7) of section 198 (power to make tree preservation orders) or subsection (1) of section 200 (tree preservation orders: Forestry Commissioners) and, subject to the exceptions in regulation 14, no person shall
 - a) cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage, or wilfully destroy; or
 - **b)** cause or permit the cutting down, topping, lopping, wilful damage or wilful destruction of,
 - any tree specified in the Schedule to this Order except with the written consent of the authority in accordance with regulations 16 and 17, or of the Secretary of State in accordance with regulation 23, and, where such consent is given subject to conditions, in accordance with those conditions.

Application to trees to be planted pursuant to a condition

4. In relation to any tree identified in the first column of the Schedule by the letter "T", being a tree to be planted pursuant to a condition imposed under paragraph (a) of section 197 (planning permission to include appropriate provision for preservation and planting of trees), this Order takes effect as from the time when the tree is planted.




