TRANSPORTATION CAPITAL PROGRAMME 2024-25

Report of the Director for Place Management

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1. This report provides details of the proposed Transportation capital programme for 2024/25 and where possible an indicative programme for future years.
- 1.2. The transportation capital programme is essential to the delivery of the Council's key corporate priorities including CAN, Active Communities Strategy and the Economic Plan promoting active and public transport, increasing our flood resilience, strengthening access and the sense of place in our regeneration areas, district and local centres and enabling reliable transport throughout the borough.
- 1.3. The highway including carriageways, footways, cycle routes and public rights of way (PROW) is the Council's largest asset, and the Council has various duties to maintain the highway (inc. PROW) and support its safe usage. The Council also seeks to undertake improvements to the highway network to support the Council's, Greater Manchester's, and the Government's priorities.
- 1.4. The highway network is managed utilising an asset management approach under the strategic direction of the Transportation Asset Management Plan which is due to be reviewed in 2024/25. The highway assets include carriageways, footways, bridleways, highway structures, streetlights, highway drainage and culverts, signs and street furniture. As part of the overall approach to asset management, these assets whether on the highway, public rights of way, cemeteries or parks etc. are moving towards being managed and maintained by one team under one budget.
- 1.5. Delivery of the transportation capital programme is still challenging with continuing shortages of various materials although to a lesser extent than in previous years. In addition while the significant inflation in the construction sector both in the costs of materials and overall costs because of fuel increases has lessened from its previous levels, this is still a challenge as the funding provision is static, meaning the funding will provide less in terms of delivery than in previous years.
- 1.6. As requested by Government on 20 July 2021, we supported the TfGM submission to the Government's City Region Sustainable Transport Fund in early September 2021, for £1.19 billion of capital funding for the period 2022/23 to 2026/27:
- 1.7. As a result GMCA was allocated £1.07 billion of capital funding. This does not have any allowance for increase as a reflection of inflation during that period. The department will seek to manage the inflation through value engineering and scheme prioritisation.

- 1.8. The transportation capital programme is funded from a variety of sources including CRSTS funding via the Greater Manchester Combined Authority, specific grants from Government including: Major Road Network Funding and Active Travel Funds and individual scheme bids e.g. the Mayors Walking and Cycling Fund, and A6 to Manchester Airport Relief Road (A6MARR). There are also schemes funded by developers via the section 106 and 278 processes. The Council is also using prudential borrowing to fund the Street Lighting LED Investment Programme. The programme will come to an end in financial year 2025/26.
- 1.9. The CRSTS Maintenance Funding, Minor works/road safety (ITB) Funding and Pothole Funding for 2024/25 are all subject to allocation confirmation by GM Bee Network Committee.

3.5. A6 Manchester Airport Relief Road

3.5.1. In 2024/25 there is £4.297m to be utilised to address issues identified with the A6MARR, to complete land transactions, and to provide any necessary compensation needed as a result of the road scheme.

3.6. Merseyway

- 3.6.1. There has been £0.625m of CRSTS maintenance funding allocated to the continuing Merseyway waterproofing and the resurfacing project on Merseyway and Deanery Way North.
- 3.6.2. Merseyway Car Park work will also continue with £1.139m allocated for the 2024/25 financial year.

3.7. Poynton Relief Road

3.7.1. In 2024/25 the costs related to Poynton Relief road being undertaken by Cheshire East in Stockport will be an estimated £0.683m.

3.8. A34 Major Route Network

3.8.1. A successful Outline Business Case was submitted in Summer 2021 for a programme of highway capacity and active travel schemes along the A34 corridor to be funded by government. The Full Business Case (FBC) was submitted in March 2023. The government approved the FBC in November 2023 awarding £33.6million of funding for A34 corridor. This will allow the scheme to be delivered between spring 2024 and 2027. £11.048m will be utilised in 2024/25.

3.9. Bee Network

3.9.1. **Bus**

- 3.9.1.1. **Pinchpoint schemes –Tranche 1** continuing to develop and starting to deliver in 2024/25. Development costs of £0.699m to deliver schemes worth circa £2m on Dialstone Lane, the A6, Compstall Road Romiley, Bramhall Lane and develop a scheme on Broadstone Road.
- 3.9.1.2. **Pinchpoint schemes –Tranche 2** –Development of schemes for Marple Road and Churchgate, and delivery of Churchgate as well as Broadstone Road scheme from tranche 1 with total funding of £0.433m.
- 3.9.1.3. A6 Radials forms part of the CRSTS programme. For Stockport a first phase of works on the A6 will extend from Crossley Road to Heaton Road. It includes junction and crossing improvements and provision of a new southbound bus lane over the full length. Parallel cycle routes will also be developed either side of the A6 along with cross routes between them. Consultation over the proposals is planned for Feb / March 2024 with Committee approval expected to be sought in Summer 2024. Subject to approvals and agreement of funding implementation is expected from 2025 to 2027.

- 3.9.1.4. **A560 QBT** forms part of the CRSTS programme. For Stockport a first phase of works on the A560 and B6014 will extend from Great Portwood Street to George Lane. It includes junction and crossing improvements and provision of improved bus stop facilities close to them. Cycle facilities are proposed to be improved in Bredbury and Woodley. Consultation over the proposals is planned for Feb / March 2024 with Committee approval expected to be sought in Summer 2024. Subject to approvals and agreement of funding implementation is expected from 2025 to 2027.
- 3.9.1.5. Stockport Council has been allocated £0.5m for improvements to bus stops. £0.5m for signage and lining related to bus facilities Both of these allocations are subject to successful business cases being developed. Development funding of £0.036m has already been awarded for the signing and lining project and work has commenced.

3.9.2. Walking and Cycling Bids

- 3.9.2.1. **Mayoral Walking and Cycling Fund** Work on the interchange is nearing completion, however, associated schemes on the A6 (Wellington Road South), Station Road and Mersey Square will be delivered in 2024/25. This will be funded by Mayoral Challenge funding as part of the Interchange programme and also a contribution of £0.6m from United Utilities towards Sustainable Urban Drainage in Mersey Square.
- 3.9.2.2. **Active Travel Fund 2 -** Market place and Underbank scheme to be completed on site, Mauldeth Road, part of the Heatons Cycle Link, will be completed on site and the next phase of the Edgeley to Stockport scheme.
- 3.9.2.3. Active Travel Fund 4 Stockport have three schemes: Romiley to Stockport scheme elements, Heatons Cycle link elements and the upgrade of Bridleway on the Ladybrook Valley. These will be implemented in 2024/25
- 3.9.2.4. **Active Travel Fund 4(É) -** A new Toucan crossing on Bramhall Park Road is subject to a bid for funding to the Active Travel Fund and if approved will be subject to consultation in spring 2024.
- 3.9.2.5. A Mayoral Challenge Fund Urban Traffic Control Scheme at Heaton Moor Road / Peel Moat Road / Bromfield Road is expected to be built in 2024/25 subject to a current bid for ATF4(E) funding
- 3.9.3. **CRSTS- Streets for All Schemes:** These schemes will be undertaken:
- 3.9.3.1. A6/School Lane/ Heaton Moor Road Heaton Chapel, A6 / Cambridge Road crossing and Broadstone Road / Downham Rd / Nelstrop Road crossings are approved and expected to be on site in 2024/25
- 3.9.3.2. Hempshaw Lane / Dialstone Lane / Banks Lane and Hempshaw Lane / Marple Road junction improvements are approved and expected to be on site in 2024/25
- 3.9.3.3. Bredbury to Woodley Pedestrian and cycle improvements are approved and expected to be on site in 2024/25

3.9.4. **CRSTS Potential Improvement Projects**

- 3.9.4.1. Subject to satisfactory business cases approval the following projects will be funded through the CRSTS note all funding is estimates:
 - Town Centre West £4m Including a substantial junction improvement at the Railway Road / A6 junction with improved capacity

to serve the Stockport Exchange development and walking and cycling facilities to the latest standards. Town Centre West CRSTS scheme is made up of £3.6m CRSTS plus £0.300m TCAP contribution.

 Greek Street Bridge - £22m – Including works to provide improved crossing facilities at the roundabout following bridge replacement and an improved network of cycle routes in the vicinity.

3.9.5. CRSTS Strategic Maintenance

- 3.9.5.1. The council has been allocated £4.5m for strategic maintenance projects this will be utilised for the following projects subject to satisfactory business cases being approved:
 - Greek Street Bridge and Stockholm Road Bridge Contribution to the Network Rail projects at both these sites.
 - Queens Road Bridge it is proposed to use the remainder of the funding after the provision for the above work to undertake the replacement / repair of the Queens Road Bridge.

3.9.6. Capability Fund

- 3.9.6.1. Hazel Grove Area Transport Study has been submitted to TfGM and approved providing funding of £0.085m
- 3.9.6.2. Study High Lane to Stepping Hill This study is well progressed examining cycle route options along the A6 corridor and may feed into an A6(MRN) bid in 2024/25 for funding to implement such a scheme and other improvements.
- 3.9.6.3. Heatons Active Neighbourhood, design and consultation This has been developed and is ready for consultation in summer 2024.
- 3.9.6.4. Paths and Accessibility Funding, the CATNIP study has identified several hundred urban paths in Stockport suitable for improvement to provide accessible walking and in some cases cycling routes. The study will feed future bids.

3.10. Network Improvement and Road Safety Funding

3.10.1. A range of funding is used to support the network improvement and road safety programme for 2024/25 which is proposed to include the following schemes:

- 3.10.2. **Work to improve road safety near schools.** The Council is providing £0.090m of funding from the maintenance funding to investigate road safety issues around their sites and follow up work. Physical measures which may be recommended will vary from school to school but may include:
 - New controlled crossings
 - Upgrades to School Crossing Patrol points
 - Improvements to street lighting
 - Identifying walking routes and preferred uncontrolled crossing points
 - Widening of footways
 - Revised speed limits and waiting restrictions (20mph)
 - Amended signage
 - Improved road markings.
- 3.10.3. The list for 2024/25 school safety investment is below.

3.10.4. The £0.050m road safety funding from CRSTS funds will be utilised to support both the provision of speed indicator devices for the borough to monitor the specific areas where concerns have been raised including supporting the new technology roll out and; improving road safety through reactive works should safety concerns come forward throughout the year and addressing issues identified by GMP on the network to maintain safety and improve movement of traffic.

Funding will continue to be invested in to highways maintenance, however, due to extreme financial pressures faced by the council it is not possible to fund a second round of borrowing for a Highways Investment Programme at the current time.

3.20. A further reserve scheme of resurfacing work on Stockport Road between Councillor Lane to Roscoes Roundabout with an estimated cost of £0.195m could also be undertaken if funding allows.

3.21. Cheadle's Town Investment Plan

- 3.21.1. Business cases for Cheadle Rail station and the Cheadle Active travel package was submitted in March 2022. The approved Town Deal funding will be utilised in 2024/25 to:
- 3.21.2. Continue work on the new rail station joining Cheadle to the wider public transport network transforming accessibility to Stockport Town Centre and beyond. This work will include: proving replacement parking for the hospital site, and providing cycle and walking access to the station. This scheme has now got planning permission for delivery. There will be ITB funding contribution of £0.400m also committed to this project.

3.22. Stockport Station Improvements

3.22.1. Stockport station improvement is an ongoing aspiration for which the Council continues to seek funding. Stockport now has funding allocated for the CRSTS maintenance programme to develop the more detailed proposals for the Stockport Station redevelopment project in conjunction with key stakeholders.
