### 2. About Your Application

**9. We are seeking funding for three items that will (1) help us to upgrade our telephone system that is essential to our listening service; (2) enable us to have our advert in Stockport County FC match programmes to help raise awareness of our service; and (3) fund the purchase of cards, leaflets and other publicity material to take along to our outreach events.

#### 1. Upgrading our phone system

By 31st December 2025 all analogue telephone lines in the UK will convert to digital. As a consequence, our phone system will require essential upgrading to future-proof our listening service. The plan, led by our Central Office, is to replace all our land-line phones (desktop and headset) with internet phones (VoIP) and upgrade the broadband to provide the speed required for our service. Whilst Central Office will pay the installation costs, we will have to fund the purchase of:

- 4 VoIP desk phones
- · 3 USB headsets
- 3 cordless headsets
- Router extensions and ethernet cables

#### 2. Stockport County FC match programme advert

Suicide is the biggest killer of men under 50 and young people aged 20-34. Three quarters of all suicides are men. However, there is still a barrier to men seeking help when they are struggling to cope. Therefore, we are keen to reach out to men in their own environment.

We have developed excellent links with Stockport County FC and have supported them with their work on men's mental health. In 2022, the Council's Ward Flexibility Funding enabled us to sponsor an electronic scoreboard advertisement and a pitch-side spectator-facing banner at the club to raise awareness of the service we provide.

This year we would like to place an advert to publicise our service in the match programmes. Spectators read match programmes and some take them home to collect or pass to others so we believe this would be an effective way of raising awareness of our service to those who have a higher risk of suicide.

#### 3. Publicity materials

This year Samaritans is the official charity of the TSC London Marathon. In addition to the race in London, branches are planning 'Town Centre Takeovers' throughout the UK to spread the word about our service during the weekend of 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> April. Our branch is currently planning an event in Stockport Town Centre. As well as this, we have several outreach events planned for this year. To all our outreach events we take along publicity material that we must purchase ourselves. This includes cards, leaflets, pens and pencils that all display our telephone number to raise awareness of the service we provide.

#### 10. Who will benefit from this grant?

Upgrading our phone system will ensure the continuity of our phone service and will improve our efficiency. We'll be able to listen to more callers and help them with their mental and emotional wellbeing. This will help many local people, young and old.

Edgeley Park has a capacity of over 10,000 and matches attract fans - predominantly men - from across the Borough. Having our advert in match programmes presents a huge opportunity to reach our target audience.

By raising awareness and promoting our service, both in match programmes and with our publicity material, more people of all ages who are struggling to cope at one point or another in their lives would be able to benefit from the service we provide. This would be to the overall benefit to the mental wellbeing of Stockport citizens and hopefully would reduce the number of people who take their own lives.

#### 10(a) How Many Stockport residents will benefit?

Samaritans' service is available to all Stockport's residents 24/7, 365 days a year. The upgraded telephone system will enable us to listen to more callers and our match programme advert and publicity material will help raise awareness of our service to local residents, particularly those most at risk of suicide.
