#### Report of the Director of Place Management

### 1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To secure funding of £10,000 from the Discretionary Budget to investigate measures to alleviate parking problems at Greenway Road and surrounding roads in Heald Green and improve the safe movement of traffic and pedestrians.

# 2. BACKGROUND

2.1. Traffic Services received a request from the Highway Ward Spokesperson for the Heald Green Ward to secure funding of £10,000 from the Discretionary Budget to investigate safety concerns as there have been ongoing complaints about motorists who use this area to park to visit the local amenities and it has been reported vehicles are obscuring visibility, hindering traffic and pedestrian movement.

3.1. To carry out investigations/site observations to compile an options report to be submitted to a future Area Committee.
