### DAVENPORT AND CALE GREEN WARD DISCRETIONARY BUDGET

#### Report of the Director of Place Management

# 1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 Request for the allocation of £10,000 in Ward Discretionary Budget to improve inclusive play opportunities within the Davenport and Cale Green Ward.

### 2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 Davenport and Cale Green Ward is served by five equipped play spaces:
  - Cale Green Play Area
  - Shaw Heath Play Area
  - Adder Park Play Area
  - Hallam Gardens Play Area
  - Bridgehall Play Area
- 2.2 Recent investment in Shaw Heath Play Area has diversified the play offering and created new play opportunities for children of different ages and abilities. This has included:
  - Inclusive ground level trampoline
  - Inclusive swings with a nest (basket) seat and mirage seat. The mirage seat is a full body support swing seat.
  - Wheelchair accessible ground level roundabout.
- 2.3 There is the need to build on this work and create accessible play opportunities within the wards other equipped play spaces.

### 3. PROPOSAL

- 3.1 That £10,000 of Discretionary Ward Budget be allocated to creating accessible play opportunities within the wards play areas.
- 3.2 The funds will be spent in consultation with stakeholders and alongside secured commuted sums to provide maximum community benefit.
- 3.3 This will include, but not limited to, the provision of a wheelchair accessible roundabout at Cale Green Play Area and the provision of inclusive mirage seats at Adder Park and Bridgehall play areas.

# 4. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

4.1 The Area Committee is requested to recommend that the Cabinet Member for Finance & Resources approves the allocation of £10,000 from the Ward Discretionary Budget (Davenport & Cale Green ward allocation) to improve inclusive play opportunities within the Davenport & Cale Green Ward's equipped play areas.
