Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

Supervising the sale of alcohol

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence—
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Age related sales

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Minimum Price of Alcohol

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(1);
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
where—
 - (i) **P** is the permitted price,
 - (ii) **D** is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) **V** is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(2).
3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

There are 7 CCTV camera which monitor the premises internally. They can be viewed from the screen on the shop counter and are in operation 24 hours a day. Recording are available for up to 28 days.

A Challenge 25 policy will be in place. Proof of age shall only comprise of a passport, photo card driving licence, a HM Forces Warrant card or a card bearing the PASS hologram.

The premises will display prominent signage indicating at any point of sale that the Challenge 25 scheme is in operation.

The premises licence will ensure all staff are trained to prevent underage sales, to be aware of and prevent proxy sales to maintain the refusals log enter sales correctly on the tills and so the prompts show as appropriate and monitor staff to ensure their training is put into practice.

Documented records of training shall be completed and kept for each member of staff. Training shall be regularly refreshed and at not greater than 6 monthly intervals

There will be an incident / refusals book which all staff dealing with the sale of alcohol will be required to complete noting incidences of refusal and the reason thereof.

No deliveries/ collections shall take place between 2000 and 0730 Monday to Saturday, none on Sundays and Bank Holidays. No bottles or similar items may be disposed of in outside receptacles between the same hours.

All staff will get refresher training. They will be trained on age verification, sale of alcohol with compliance, refuse sale for drunkenness _ underage. Records will be kept.

Premises is completely covered by CCTV monitored with night vision cameras and recordings will be saved at least for 31 days with 6TB harddrive. Recorded device in a closed cabinet and there will be signage for customers. Police can see the recordings on request to the DPS.

All customers will be asked to leave quietly. Clear _ legible notices to customers will be displayed to leave quietly _ not to disturb any neighbours.

Anyone who looks under 25yrs will be asked for ID citizen card, driving licence/passport or ID card issued by HM Forces or by an EU country.

All staff will be trained for underage sales regularly.

All refusals will be recorded.
