2. About Your Application

9. Please give us a brief description of your proposed/planned project or activityYou may wish to include details of what activities will take place, where will it happen, how often and who will take part. Local dancers from a Reddish based dance group, Cheshire Theatre School have been selected to represent Team England at the Dance World Cup. This is a massive opportunity for them to travel and compete against other teams from all around the world. The physical, mental and educational benefit from doing this at their age is immense. Dance World Cup has over 120,000 children around the world aged from 4 to 25 trying to qualify for the finals which is held annually in a different location. This year it is being held in Prague

You may remember, that last year this Committee supported the dancers to compete in the Dance World Cup held in Braga, Portugal. The dancers came back overall world champions with gold medals in two categories, runners up with silver in two categories and third place with bronze medals in one category.

The calibre of the dance schools that enter is very high, so to be selected again is amazing. This will prove to be a great, positive experience improving their self-confidence by performing on a world stage & self esteem, as well as promoting health, sport & physical activity to themselves and their friends who will be watching them compete - as the event is live streamed online.

The dancers need to pay for registration fees, entry fees, travel and costumes. This opportunity will help to promote dance as a form of physical activity and a way young people can express themselves through movement.

This opportunity for the dancers fits into the aim of the One Stockport Borough Plan - the 2030 vision to make Stockport a great place to grow - where children and young people to have the best start in life, can be happy, safe and be able to build healthy relationships which will enable them to thrive. This opportunity also fits in with the ambition from the Stockport Council Plan which is that every single neighbourhood and community across our borough can access the services that they need to be resilient, healthy and vibrant. This council aim supports the 'One Heart' ambition of the One Stockport Borough Plan to create a Stockport where people live the best lives they can. What better than to give a group of talented Stockport dancers the opportunity represent their country at an international competition.

The ambition for a people to live the best lives they can - happy, healthy and independently is also reflected in the joy and ambition of the dancers in rehearsals and at the competition. They gain so much Independence, determination and resilience from the experience as well as looking after their mental wellbeing which affected so many young people though out covid and the following years after..

It also fits with Stockport's ambition for improved health, educational and employment outcomes for marginalised groups including those living in deprived neighbourhoods such as Reddish. These young people have chosen dancing as a way of expressing themselves and as a way of getting fit and healthy in a disciplined way in their local area.

Finally the ambition that Stockport's neighbourhoods, local and district centres are exciting places to live, where people are active and celebrate culture fits perfectly. The dancers are able to share their rassion and talk it at local events with the local community as well as experiency meanwealtures and meeting cancers from all over the world whilst at the competition.

This will prove to be a great, positive experience for the dancers themselves - as it will improve self-confidence & self esteem by performing on a world stage, as well as promoting health, mental health, sport & physical activity to themselves and their friends, the different local schools they attend and many other children and families who will be watching them compete - as the event is live streamed online. The local community will also benefit from raising awareness of physical activity and healthy aspects of dance to a wide range of children from the ages of 5 years to 20 years. *the costs for these particular items are mandatory for all competitors and without them the dancers are unable to compete

All families involved with the dance group have signed up to 'The Friends of Cheshire Theatre

School easy fundraising which various retailers donate money as people shop online with them. The dancers are also going to be bag packing at local supermarkets and other fundrais-

sponsorship of the dancers . The School has secured a sponsor for the tracksuits this year. The Friends of Group has applied to become a charity and is waiting to hear back from the Charity Commission.

12. How much are you applying for from the Ward Flexibility Budget?

£960 - to contribute £60 to cover part of the registration fees for the children from the Reddish and Heaton's Wards.


