We propose to install an Interest Trail in Happy Valley. Eight posts with attached QR code plaques will be installed in places of interest around the valley. Each QR code will access a variety of information, such as facts about the nature and the history of the valley, as well as small projects the readers can do i.e. roughly calculating the height of a tree without a measure. The information on the QR codes will be updated periodically. The Friends' will attach the QR code plaques, prepare and install the posts

10. Who will benefit from this grant?

Visitors to the valley of all ages will benefit. While benefitting from a healthy walk, visitors will be able to learn more about the valley and improve their mental health by connecting with the nature around them. It is hoped the Interest Trail will help visitors become more appreciative of both the valley's nature and history and think about the valley very differently

10(a) How Many Stockport residents will benefit?

The valley is open 24 hours a day and people walk through at all times, so it is difficult to calculate the number of residents who will benefit

10(b) Are there any restrictions on who will benefit from the funding?

Those who do not have a mobile phone will not be able to access the QR codes. We decided against producing leaflets as there are no facilities to store them, they could become discarded rubbish and continued reproduction of the leaflets would be bad for the environment and become prohibitive
