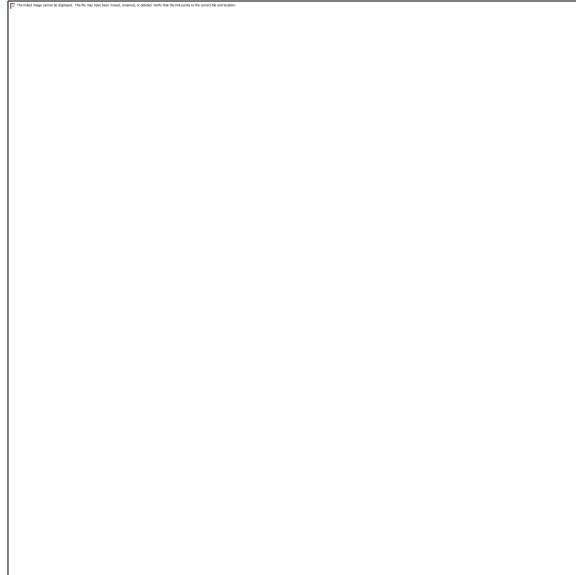

## **Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions**

### **Supervising the sale of alcohol**

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence—
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### **Age related sales**

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
  - (a) a holographic mark, or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

### **Minimum Price of Alcohol**

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
  - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(1);
  - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
where—
    - (i) **P** is the permitted price,
    - (ii) **D** is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
    - (iii) **V** is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
  - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
    - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
    - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
    - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
  - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
  - (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(2).
3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

## **Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule**

Staff will be trained before making sales of alcohol in their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003. Refresher training will take place at 6 monthly intervals. All training will be documented and made available to the authorities on reasonable request.

A CCTV system will be in operation at the premises and recorded images shall be retained for a period of 31 days. CCTV images will be provided to the police and other responsible authorities as soon as practicable and in any case within 48 hours of a request for such images, subject of the provisions of the DPA.

A register of refusals of alcohol will be maintained at the premises. The register shall be examined on a regular basis by the duty manager/ DPS and the date and time of each examination will be endorsed in the register. The register will be made available for inspection by the Police and other responsible authority.

An incident register will be maintained at the premises and made available to the authorities on request.

A notice will be on display asking that the customers leave the area quietly and respect the local residents.

The premises shall be protected adequate crime prevention security measures, to include a smoke generating security device, manufactured to ISO9001 which shall be maintained, tested and serviced on a regular basis to ensure functionality in accordance with EN50131-8 compliance.

No noise shall emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to neighbouring residential properties.

No vehicle operated by the business shall be allowed to stand idling outside the premises.

Noise shall be constantly monitored and recorded at the frontage of the premises. Such recordings shall be retained for a period of 28 days and made available to any person specified in s13 of the Licensing Act upon demand.

Any person causing unreasonable noise in or in the vicinity of the premises shall not be served as a customer.

Between the hours of 01:00 and 05:00hrs

a Customers will only be admitted to the premises upon request, and otherwise the doors shall be

locked, and

b All doors and windows shall be kept closed other than for the purposes of entry and egress.

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that any person who purchases from any website or app shall register with the website or app. Such registration details shall include the persons full name, full address, date of birth and phone number. Records of such registrations shall be kept for a period of 12 months and shall be produced on demand of the police or an authorised person (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of the Council.

The terms and conditions of the website or app will contain the following

a The company will not sell alcohol to any person until it has been verified that the person is over 18 years of age.

b An age confirmation requirement when registering to purchase.

c Reference to the operating of a Challenge 25 policy.

d That no parcels will be left by the courier if the person at the delivery address is under 18 years of age.

The person delivering the alcohol to the premises shall operate a Challenge 25 policy and shall require proof of age prior to the alcohol being handed over. No alcohol shall be handed over to a person under 18. The only acceptable proof of identity shall be a photographic drivers licence, a passport or an Identity Card containing the PASS Hologram. The website shall contain a declaration to this effect.

Deliveries shall only be made to residential or business addresses

The premises will adopt a Challenge 25 policy. This means that if a customer purchasing alcohol appears to be under the age of 25, they will be asked for proof of their age, to prove that they are 18 years or older.

Posters will be on display advising customers of the Challenge 25 policy.

The only forms of identification that will be accepted at the premises are a passport, UK photo-card driving licences, military ID & cards bearing the PASS hologram.
